- Our region, thanks to webmaster extraordinaire Sydney Mace, now has one of the most up-to-date, informative websites in the country.
- Our room at the Storr House is complete--this effort was spearheaded on the national level by Fran Alley, on the region level by Linda Eason-and it has drawn attention from other groups besides EGA
- Carolinas has found a home for a yearly regional seminar at Ridgecrest, and continues to keep the costs low to enable as many EGA members as possible to attend.
- The region has started sponsoring the tuition costs for two correspondence courses a year for our members, additionally enabling as many Carolinas members as possible the opportunity to expand their stitching horizons.
- Our chapters continue to be involved in outreach in their individual communities and to teach children, our future, to love embroidery as much as we do.

I did none of these things--they are all accomplishments that an extraordinary group of volunteers in our Carolinas region made happen. For this, I can only thank you for making this one of the most memorable periods of my life in EGA.

We still have obstacles to overcome--our population is aging overall, and our membership numbers continue to drop. However, I know that this region will continue to produce some of the most spectacular activities and experiences for our members to enjoy in their pursuit of fine stitchery.

There are many dynamic situations occurring on the national front as well. New membership categories, including a special children's membership, will allow us to spread the message to more embroiderers than ever. EGA is planning to move to a better headquarters situation in the coming year, one that will allow us more room and more exposure, while removing the problems of continuing leaks into our current offices at the Brown Hotel. New president Karen Wojahn plans to continue our support of the American Heart Association's research into women's heart health issues.

REGION MEMBERSHIP

Chapter Presidents, it is your responsibility to send:

- A membership roster to the region director and membership chairman by Jan 15.
- An EGA Chapter Officer Change list of elected officers and appointed committee chairpersons to the national office, the region director, region membership, and RegioNews editor anytime during the year that you have changes occur in those positions.

If your officers have changed more than 2 weeks ago and you haven't sent in this list, we will forgive the oversight if you will send it <u>now</u>.

I've been the region membership person for a year and a half now and have received officer and committeeupdates from less than five chapters. Those of you who share your newsletter with me either online or by mail, I am able to update officers and committees from that, but I would really love to have it sent to me in a timely manner.

I have no idea what is happening concerning membership at the national level and who the employed membership person is, but I am sure that sometime after the first of the year, that information will be available. Membership is very important to EGA. In the meantime chapter membership still needs to be taken care of in the same manner in which it has always been done. Each chapter should be receiving a list of those members whose membership is due for renewal each quarter, from national. First quarter membership closes March 31, 2nd quarter closes June 30, 3rd quarter closes Sept.30, and 4th quarter closes Dec 31. As membership person you need to send the renewal, new members and withdrawals to national and to the region treasurer by the 15th of the next month. i.e. April 15, July 15, Oct.15 and Jan. 15. At the region level the treasurer processes the dues and then sends the renewals, new members, and withdrawals on to me. Remember that after Jan. 2006 the Carolinas Region will have a new treasurer, Mary Edens. Mary is a member of the Charlotte Chapter. General internet hint:

If you go back to the page Augusta event page, and it is still showing 2005, click on the "refresh" button in your toolbar (it is the one with the circular green arrows). Or, go into "view" and click on "refresh".

This is something you may want to do every time you access the web, especially when returning to previously viewed pages. Why? A previously viewed page gets held in your cache (sounds slightly risqué, doesn't it?) so when you access it again, you see the earlier viewed version, and not the updated one. "Refresh" tells your computer to look for and show an updated page, if any.


CHAPTER HAPPENINGS

Cricket Description:

Cricket is a non-charted design mixing fabrics, fibers, stitches, beading, stumpwork techniques, and random pattern darning (background). Each "Cricket" will be an individual! Overembellishing layers of manipulated bonded sheer fabrics, padding, layering and stuffing for stumpwork, beading (using a variety of different colors and types of beads, stitches and techniques), creating Crickets legs using a wrapped wire armature, and creating 'cast shadows' and dimension with stitches, techniques, color placement, and padding will be taught.

TECHNIQUE: Mixed Media

PROFICIENCY: Basic - intermediate PREWORK: none

DESIGN AREA: 4 1/4 x 8 1/2

KIT CONTENTS: Pre-drawn design on Congress cloth, fibers, threads, beads, fabrics for finishing, wire, felt, stuffing cotton

Treasurer, Sherrie Gillespie made the following report:

Checking Balance \$20,748.01 Time Deposit \$7,397.36 Dreyfus Balance \$8,332.12 Complete report on file. Proposed budget for 2006 was presented. Discussion was invited with no response. The vote to accept the budget was unanimous.

Merchandise Sales: Sales at EGA National Seminar Merchandise Night were good primarily because of the sweet baskets and the new chart to fit them. Thanks to Cissy Smith & Louise Henderson for the design.

Executive Committee Recommendation, Ann Blalock:

The sweetgrass baskets are still sellable. We still have T-shirts & soaps that are not selling even after reducing the price last year. After discussing the option of bringing these 2 items to this meeting for the attendees to take the ones they want and to give the rest to charity, a vote was taken. The results were Yes by all but one No.

Education Coordinator, Louise Henderson:

GCC's: 47 signed up for To the Acorn and 19 signed up for Grrcia for a total of 66. We will offer 2 at a time next year too. Today's "Make-It-Take-It" is a Bodkin holder (designed by Louise). The students are urged to take the project, copy the directions, and teach it to their chapters.
