Carolinas Region EGA Board

Meeting Minutes October 28, 2007

Opening. Region Director Sandy Plain called the regular meeting to order at 10:00 AM on Sunday, October 28, 2007, at The Breakers, Myrtle Beach, SC.

Present. Region Director Sandy Plain, Assistant RD Katrina Lawrimore, Treasurer Mary Edens, Secretary/Website Coordinator Sydney Mace, Membership Chair Susanne Osterberg, and Outreach Chair Janine Bangs.

Chapter delegates (members) present: Aiken Stitchin' Belles-1 (1), Augusta-2 (4), Blue Ridge-2 (2), Cardinal-2 (2), Charlotte-1 (2), Chicora Stitchers-1 (2), Florence Area-2 (2), Gifted Hands-1 (3), Laurel-2 (3), Millwood-1 (1), Piedmont-1 (1), and Tryon-2 (2).

Chapters not represented: Draper's Meadow, Golden Needles, Low Country, Magnolia, Scotch Bonnet, Spartan Samplers, Star Stitchers, Tar River, and Up Country.

Quorum. There being delegates from more than one-third (7) of the chapters in attendance, a quorum was present.

Minutes. Upon motion made by Ms. Osterberg, and seconded, the minutes of June 1, 2007, were approved.

Treasurer, Mary Edens. After discussion and upon motion made by Ms. Osterberg, and seconded, it was voted to accept the treasurer's report as follows: Checking account: January 1, 2007, beginning balance was \$24,077.69, plus receipts of \$3,955.72, less disbursements of \$4,051.31, results in October 28 balance \$23,982.10. Other assets as of October 28: CRESS Fund (Dreyfus investments) \$17,057.93, Time Deposit \$7,663.97. Total assets at October 28 of \$41,040.03.

2008 budget. Upon motion duly made by Ms. Bangs, and seconded, it was voted to approve the 2008 budget as presented.

Membership, Susanne Osterberg. Danville and Needle Gems Chapters have dissolved. Region membership stands at about 625 through the second quarter of 2007.

Seminar, Katrina Lawrimore. The 2007 seminar was profitable. Color previews of the 2008 classes are in each chapter folder. The 2008 brochure will be mailed to all members during the last week of 2007.

After discussion, and upon motion duly made by Ms. Mace, and seconded, it was voted to donate 100% of the proceeds from 2008 seminar opportunity baskets back to the submitting chapters.

EGA Annual Fund. After discussion, and upon recommendation of the Executive Committee, it was voted to donate \$300 to the EGA Annual Fund.

Annual dues increase. Ms. Plain noted that as previously reported, national dues will increase by \$3.00 per member effective January 1, 2008.

Education Grant. After discussion and upon recommendation of the executive committee, it was voted a grant in 2008 in the amount of \$100 per chapter for educational purposes, to be obtained by written request to the region director stating the purpose.

Time to Teach Grant. After discussion and upon motion made by Susanne Osterberg, and seconded, it was voted without opposition to amend the Carolinas Region Time to Teach Grant to remove the annual \$200 limit for 2008 and to provide a grant in 2008 of up to \$50 per chapter for reimbursement of materials used in a program to educate youth in embroidery arts.

Bylaws. After discussion, and upon recommendation from the Executive Committee, it was voted that:

- A. The proposed 2007 Carolinas Region Bylaws be approved, subject to revising appropriate provisions to reflect: (1) the Board of Directors will include chairs of the standing committees and two voting representatives from each chapter, namely the president and region representative; (2) staggered terms for the nominating committee as approved September 2002; and (3) permit officers of the Carolinas Region to hold concurrent terms as national officer, chapter president, or chapter representative.
- B. Members of the executive committee be appointed to the Bylaws Committee to negotiate the changes with national.
- C. When national approves the changes, the 2007 Carolinas Region Bylaws stand approved and may be signed by the Region Director.

Ms. Plain appointed Ms. Lawrimore and Ms. Mace to serve as the Bylaws Committee.

Slate of Officers 2008-2009. Ms. Plain read the Nominating Committee's report that Katrina Lawrimore, Michelle Burroughs, and Diane Stavola respectively consented to serve as region director, assistant region director, and treasurer for 2008-2009. There being no nominations from the floor, and upon motion duly made by Sallie Folk, and seconded, it was voted to approve the slate officers as presented.

Chapter news. Chapter members described recent program, outreach, and other events of their respective chapters.

In honor of Sandy Plain. Ms. Lawrimore reported that \$50 will be donated to the EGA General Fund in honor of outgoing Carolinas Region Director Sandy Plain.

Next meeting. The next meeting will be held on Friday, June 7, 2008, at the Ridgecrest Conference Center, Ridgecrest, NC.

Adjournment. The meeting then adjourned.
