CRES SCHOLARSHIP 2007

The <u>C</u>arolinas <u>R</u>egion <u>E</u>mbroidery <u>S</u>tudy <u>S</u>cholarship, or CRESS, supplies \$200.00 towards the cost of a class for embroidery study, not including EGA Region Seminars and the National EGA Seminar. The class can be an ESP or Individual Correspondence course.

CRES Scholarships are available to any region member. To apply, you must write an essay including the title of the class chosen, why you would like to take the class, and the benefits you could share with other members of the region. TEA CUP OPPORTUNITY DRAWING AT 2007 REGION SEMINAR

This is a fund raising opportunity. Each chapter is invited to provide items for the drawing, or a basket. A portion of the proceeds from each basket will be donated to the submitting chapter.

2007 REGION CHALLENGE

The theme for the 2007 Region Challenge is *It Isn't Easy Being Green*, suggested by Rhoda Stein (Cardinal Chapter). This should be an original design or original interpretation that must be inspired by or relate to the theme. It can be of any size, and in any medium that uses a threaded needle.

Completed pieces will be exhibited at the seminar, and ribbons will be presented for Teachers' Choices and Viewers' Choice.

REGION DUES DECREASE

Region dues have decreased by \$1.00, from \$5.00 to \$4.00 per year per member. The decrease is effective January 1, 2007, for new members and renewals after December 31, 2006. Chapters may decide to retain the decrease, or to pass it on to their chapter members.

2007 REGION EDUCATION GRANT

A one-time grant is available in 2007 for chapters in the Carolinas Region. The grant is in the amount of \$100 per chapter to be used for educational purposes in 2007. To apply for the grant, chapters should write region director Sandy Plain, explaining what the grant will be used for.

REGION TIME TO TEACH GRANT

A grant of up to \$50 per chapter is available in 2007 for reimbursement of the cost of materials used in a program teaching embroidery to youth (note that teaching fees are not covered). To apply for the grant, send a completed *Time to Teach* form to region director Sandy Plain, remembering to attach receipts.

NEEDLEWORK STAMP PETITION REJECTED

According to a report in the December 2006 of the Mid-Eastern Region newsletter, the stamp petition was rejected. This means there is probably no chance that a needlework themed U.S. postage stamp will be issued in 2008. EGA is assessing the next course of action.

CONSIDERATIONS IN CHOOSING THE NATIONAL EGA SEMINAR HOTEL

There was much discussion about this at the November 12, 2006, region meeting. While members made it clear that they would appreciate less expensive room rates, the following points were noted.

The national seminar is the annual premier EGA event and the hotel is selected with this in mind. Due to doubling/tripling up, rooms occupied by seminar participants equal only about 1/3 of total seminar participation, and participants spend little elsewhere in the hotel (eg, the bar). Yet EGA requires the use of **all** of a hotel's facilities: meeting space, tables, chairs, tablecloths, a-v equipment, and so forth. These somewhat opposing factors directly affect the cost to EGA and seminar attendees.

NEW EGA BROCHURE

A new brochure was unveiled at the national seminar. It's warm and inviting, and features color clips of pieces in EGA's collection. The new tag line is, "~ fostering the art of embroidery and a passion for needlework ~". Order your supply now from EGA HQ.

NATIONAL EGA HEADQUARTERS

Headquarters is well ensconced in its new location at 426 West Jefferson Street, Louisville, KY 40202-3202. Facilities include the Margaret Parshall Gallery, antique collection, library, and gift shop on street level. The board room, two classrooms, offices, and a kitchen are on the second floor.

2007 NATIONAL EGA SEMINAR

The 2007 national seminar, *That Needlin' Town*, will be held September 2-8, 2007 in Chicago, Illinois. Early registration is closed, and regular registration will open soon. Carolinas Region, EGA, Board Meeting

November 12, 2006 Minutes

Opening. Region Director Sandy Plain called the regular meeting to order at 9:50 AM on Sunday, November 12, 2006, at The Breakers, Myrtle Beach, SC, and noted that Sydney Mace would take minutes in the absence of Secretary Rita Ulam.

Present. Region Director Sandy Plain, Assistant RD Katrina Lawrimore, Treasurer Mary Edens, Education Coordinator Louise Henderson, Membership Chair Susanne Osterberg, Website Coordinator Sydney Mace, Nominating Committee Member Jeannette Lovensheimer.

Chapter members: Aiken Stitchin' Belles-1, Augusta-2, Blue Ridge-1, Cardinal-2, Charlotte-2, Chicora Stitchers-2, Florence Area-5, Gifted Hands-2, Laurel-2, Magnolia-1, Piedmont-2, Scotch Bonnet-1, and Tryon-1.

Chapters not represented were: Danville, Draper's Meadow, Golden Needles, Low Country, Millwood, Needle Gems, Spartan Samplers, Star Stitchers, Tar River, and Up Country.

Quorum. There being representatives from 13 chapters in attendance, a quorum was present.

Minutes. Upon motion made by Susanne Osterberg, and seconded, the minutes of June 2, 2006, were approved with the following corrections:

- A. Delete the 8th through 10th sentences from the 4th paragraph of C. Reports, beginning with "Karen Wojahn" and ending "\$50 per term", and insert 3 new paragraphs as follows:
- B. National pays the travel and hotel expenses of a national president who attends a region seminar. Upon motion duly made, and seconded, it was voted to invite the national president to attend the 2007 Carolinas Region Seminar, and to pay her class fee, kit cost, and meals from region funds.
- C. Upon recommendation of the Carolinas region executive committee, it was voted to donate 100% of the proceeds from each opportunity basket to each submitting chapter, and to re-evaluate this practice annually.
- D. Upon motion duly made, and seconded, it was voted that the recognition for outgoing region director will be in the form of a donation to an EGA fund, or to a charity of the individual's choice, in the amount of \$50.00 for each term served.

Treasurer, Mary Edens. Upon motion made by Rhoda Stein, and seconded, it was voted without opposition to accept the treasurer's report as follows: Checking account: June 1 beginning balance was \$24,383.88, plus receipts of \$1,191, less disbursements of \$822.52, results in November 11 ending balance \$24,752.36. Other assets as of September 29: Dreyfus Short Term \$4,294.87 and Intermediate \$4,894.08, Time Deposit \$7,515.76. Total assets at November 11: \$41,457.07.

Assistant Region Director, Katrina Lawrimore. All region members are encouraged to apply for the Carolinas Region Education Study Scholarship (CRESS), and to enter the Roxie Hodgkin Scholarship drawing. The 2007 Carolinas Region Seminar classes were described, with reference to the description and color handouts provided in each chapter folder. Color pictures are also available on the region website. A manager for the seminar bookstore is needed. The 2006 bookstore cleared over \$500.

Membership Chair, Susanne Osterberg. Region membership as of October 1 was 621, down from 643 at July 1, ranging from 9 to 58 members in each chapter. A handout was provided in the chapter folders describing the quarterly reporting process. Presidents and region reps were encouraged to assist their chapters' membership chairs in understanding and following the procedure to disperse dues and report membership information on a timely basis.

Sandy noted that Needle Gems Chapter, Franklin, NC, is in the process of disbanding.

Website Coordinator, Sydney Mace. The website experienced more than 2,200 visits since it was launched in October 2004, including 300 since the beginning of this past June. New features included a links page and "fun and interesting stuff".

Education Coordinator, Louise Henderson. *To the Acorn* pieces are expected to be returned to students around the beginning of December. Student texts for the 2007 group correspondence courses are expected from the teachers by Christmas; start date will be announced at that time.

Outreach Chair, Sandy Plan reporting for Mary Mahaffey. Chapters should continue to send their newsletters to Mary, and/or submit written reports of outreach activities on a timely basis.

RegioNews, Sandy Plain reporting for Rita Ulam. The executive committee decided to resume quarterly issues of *RegioNews*. In the short term, items for the newsletter can be sent to Sydney Mace who will be working with Rita.

2007/2008 officers. Nominating committee member Jeannette Lovensheimer reported that Karla Gee and Sydney Mace respectively consented to serve as education coordinator and secretary for 2007 and 2008. There being no nominations from and floor, and upon motion duly made by Susanne Osterberg, and seconded, it was voted to approve the slate officers unanimously as presented.

Nominating committee: Upon motion duly made by Sydney Mace, and seconded, Terry Belanger was elected to serve the remainder of Katrina Lawrimore's term on the nominating committee through 2008. Upon motion duly made by Susie Brown, and seconded, Ann Blalock was elected to serve on the nominating committee through 2009 replacing Jeannette Lovensheimer.

Region Director, Sandy Plain

A. National notes. A new membership brochure is available; one was included in each chapter folder. It was noted that the brochure includes a new definition of embroidery. The 2006 national seminar was well attended (about 700) and reportedly enjoyed by all, including the all day emporium. Pictures of the 2007 seminar in Chicago are on the national website; Karla Gee, Blue Ridge Chapter, is one of the teachers. Future national seminars are scheduled for 2008-Louisville, KY; 2009-Pittsburgh, PA; 2010-San Francisco, CA; 2011-possibly Florida. Anita Streeter is the new executive director of EGA; comes from non-profit background. Chapter presidents should expect the national president's mailing soon.

There was considerable discussion of how sites for the national seminar are selected, and whether they could be held at less expensive locations.

B. Region notes. Following the model of the national board in addressing issues between meeting sessions, items will be submitted to the region board for consideration via email. A new outreach chair may be needed. Volunteers are needed for various seminar duties, as well as for national nominating committee. Updated region bylaws, and policies and procedures will be circulated for consideration via email. Louise Henderson volunteered to coordinate the region's opportunity basket for the 2007 national seminar. Congratulations were extended to the Florence Area Chapter on its new website; it was created using orgsites.com, which offers this service free to non-profit organizations. Chapter reports due at year end are the EGA chapter officers' change list, annual chapter reports to the RD, and annual financial report. Laura Smith, Golden Needles Chapter, received the first place 2006 Bobby Pilling Memorial Award for an original work that "goes outside the lines". Sydney Mace, Laurel Chapter, received the 2006 Carolinas Region Gold Thread Award.

Region dues. After discussion and upon recommendation of the executive committee, it was voted without opposition to decrease annual dues by \$1.00 per member, from \$5.00 to \$4.00, effective January 1, 2007, with respect to memberships renewing after 2006.

Education grant. After discussion and upon recommendation of the executive committee, it was voted without opposition to establish a one-time grant in 2007 in the amount of \$100 per chapter for educational purposes, to be obtained by written request to the region director stating the purpose.

Time to Teach Grant. After discussion and upon motion made by Susanne Osterberg, and seconded, it was voted without opposition to amend the Carolinas Region Time to Teach Grant to remove the annual \$200 limit for 2007 and to provide a grant in 2007 of up to \$50 per year per chapter for reimbursement of materials used in a program to educate youth in embroidery arts.

2007 budget. After discussion and upon motion made by Carolyn Doerr, and seconded, it was voted without opposition to accept the 2007 budget as proposed, and incorporated herein by reference, with changes to reflect today's votes (see items G, H, and I herein).

Educational opportunity. It was noted for the record that at the June 3, 2005, region meeting it was voted to pay up to \$5.00 per kit from region funds for the first 50 members who sign up for and take the fall education opportunity. This action was not recorded in the published minutes of that or any intervening meeting. (See "from the director's chair" column of the Summer-Fall 2005 issue of *RegioNews*, volume XXII, no. 2.)

Chapter news. Michelle Borroughs reported that the Augusta Chapter will be offering a 2-day workshop in March 2007, featuring a Rozashi design taught by Margaret Kinsey. She reported that Augusta Chapter had a successful summer teaching youth embroidery classes to over 300 students at the local library. Adult classes were also offered, which resulted in 2 new members for the chapter. An exhibit and presentation was made at a Girl Scouts council, which resulted in more classes for young people.

Karla Gee announced that the Blue Ridge Chapter will be cohosting a 3-day workshop with Seven Hills ANG on July 19-21, 2007, "Sculptural Beading on Canvas, taught by Joyce Lukomski.

Next meeting. The next meeting will be held at 2:00 PM on June 1, 2007, at the Ridgecrest Conference Center, Ridgecrest, NC.

Adjournment. RD Sandy Plain adjourned the meeting at 11:45 AM.
