The ladies from the shore also collect kits for the VA hospital in Charleston and a woman's correction facility in Ohio. Tryon Chapter stitchers in New Bern, NC continue with their Hospice doves project. In Aiken, SC the Aiken Stitchin' Belles have been busy with Kissing Pillows for our troops and laprobes and fingerless gloves to a local nursing home. The Belles continue making Cuddle Buddies, which are special animal blankets, for children at the local Child Advocacy Center by recently donating 35 Cuddle Buddies. Also, please make sure your members are aware of the additional sentence, which reads "EGA prohibits the use of membership lists other than for EGA purposes." This amendment was approved by the EGA board of directors in March 2009.

WEBSITE UPDATED

The Carolinas Region website has been updated in various places, including the list of the 2010 region-sponsored correspondence courses.

Second, to test for links to websites which are inappropriate according to the EGA website guidelines.
