Community Outreach

Hello Fellow Stitchers,

This report covers information I have received regarding chapter Outreach activities since June, 2010. The Aiken Stitchin' Belles continue to keep the local Child Advocacy Center supplied with Cuddle Buddies. They have also done a large number of Kissing Pillows for our troops. The Belles took the National EGA Bookmark challenge to heart and stitched 62 bookmarks donating them to the Children's Section of the Aiken County Library. Moving across the river the Augusta chapter had a very successful class at one of the local libraries introducing needlework to over 24 participants. The chapter also continues to provide gowns, blankets and bereavement bags to a local Neonatal ICU. In Virginia the Blue Ridge chapter stitched over 300 Kissing Pillows. They continue to provide samplers for new Habitat Homes. Members are working to stitch bookmarks as part of the National program. The Blue Ridge chapter also has two industrious members who have taken on the mission of stitching in public weekly and have been working with several individuals to assist them in their stitching skills. Members of the Charlotte chapter have continued donating samplers for Habitat Homes as has the Florence chapter. The Piedmont chapter serves as a resource for local Girl Scouts. They too have donated samplers for Habitat Homes in their area. The Tryon chapter continues their work with a local hospice.

I am sure there are other outreach activites ongoing in other chapters. Please remember that each time you do something in public regarding needlework, as the ladies from the Blue Ridge chapter, it is an "outreach" promoting embroidery it does not necessarily have to be a formal program. I am looking forward to seeing many of you at our Fall meeting in Rock Hill. Be on the lookout there will be an article in the December issue of Inside EGA about outreach activities in the Carolina Region!

Article VIII Committees, Section 1, revise to read "The standing committees of this region shall be as designated by the board of directors."

REGION MEETING MINUTES: JUNE 2010

Call to order. Region Director Michelle Burroughs called the regular meeting to order at 3:12 PM on Friday, June 4, 2010, at the Ridgecrest Conference Center, Ridgecrest, NC, and welcomed EGA President Lorie Welker.

Present. Region Director Michelle Burroughs, Assistant Region Director Elizabeth Little, Treasurer Diane Stavola, Education Coordinator Karla Gee, Secretary/Bylaws Chair/Website Coordinator Sydney Mace, Membership Chair Susanne Osterberg, Outreach Chair Janine Bangs, Newsletter Editor Sallie Folk, and Nominating Committee Members Brenda Decker. Kathryn Narron, and LaDawnna Wise.

Chapter delegates (members) present: Aiken Stitchin' Belles-2 (4), Augusta-2 (5), Blue Ridge-2 (4), Cardinal-2 (7), Charlotte-1 (2), Florence Area-2 (2), Gifted Hands-2 (2), Golden Needles-1 (3), Laurel-2 (7), Low Country-2 (2), Magnolia-2 (3), Millwood-1 (3), Tar River-2 (2), total-23 from 13 chapters (46 from 14).

Chapters not represented by a voting delegate: Chicora Stitchers, Piedmont, Spartan Samplers, Star Stitchers, Tryon.

Also present: EGA President Lorie Welker.

Quorum. There being delegates from more than one-third (6) of member chapters present, a quorum was present.

Assistant Region Director. Ms. Little reported a registration of 81 for the 2010 seminar, and asked for volunteers for the 2011 seminar committee.

Treasurer. Ms. Stavola reviewed the financial statement for the first quarter of 2010. Checking account: beginning balance on January 1, 2010, of 5,618.55, plus receipts of 325, less disbursements of 848.10 resulted in March 31 ending balance of \$5,099.45. Other assets as of March 31: Seminar seed money \$10,000, CRESS Fund (Dreyfus investments) \$9,347.42, Time Deposit \$7,882.53, Money Market \$10,073.48. Total assets at September 30 of \$33,402.88. CAR has made a \$300 donation to the EGA Annual Fund, and a \$15 matching donation in honor of the Magnolia Chapter's donation to EGA.

Education Coordinator. Ms. Gee reported that 37 members enrolled in the three 2010 region-sponsored correspondence courses, compared to 63 and 56 respectively in 2009 and 2008.

CRESS. Ms. Gee presented the 2010 Carolinas Region Embroidery Study Scholarship to Pamela Allen of Cardinal Chapter.

Region Director. Ms. Burroughs announced that effective immediately all chapters will **report changes** in officers and updates to the EGA website chapter directory to region directors only. The region directors are responsible for reporting the changes to headquarters. An officer reporting form for CAR will be sent to chapters in the near future.

REGION MEETING MINUTES: JUNE 2010

Outreach. Ms. Bangs recognized the following 9 chapters with **certificates** for their outreach activities: Aiken Stitchin' Belles for cuddle bunnies; Augusta for habitat samplers; Blue Ridge for about 270 kissing pillows; Charlotte for habitat samplers; Chicora for habitat samplers and kits for VA & Ohio Reformatory for Women; Florence for habitat samplers and DVD on needlework techniques donations to library; Laurel for food and money donations to food, library displays, press releases, Johnson Farm display; Piedmont for working with Girl Scouts and fabric sent to Ukraine; Tryon for hospice doves. She reported that Aiken Stitchin' Belles have pledged 50 **bookmarks** for EGA bookmark outreach. About 8 of the chapters present today are also working on bookmarks.

Newsletter. Ms. Folk requested articles this week so the next issue can be published on a timely basis.

Bylaws. Nothing new to report.

Unfinished Business.

- **2009** Audit Report. Ms. Stavola reviewed the 2009 audit report. After discussion, and upon recommendation of the Executive Committee, it was **VOTED**: to accept the 2009 audit report.
- **2010 Region Seminar.** Seminar Registrar LaDawnna Wise reported that there are about 80 registered participants, and receipts total about \$10,000.
- **EGA Nominating Committee.** Nominating Committee Chair LaDawnna Wise urged members to come forward and volunteer for region service, in particular for the officers to be elected this fall.
- **2010 Fall Retreat.** Ms. Stavola referenced the Fall Retreat flyer and registration form in the chapter folders, and Ms. Gee spoke about the classes and trunk show. There will be a presentation about the Master Craftsman program by Laura Smith of the Golden Needles Chapter,

New Business.

Chapters' tax exempt status. In response to a question regarding recent notices from the IRS, Ms. Welker stated that EGA does file for chapters. The IRS is in the process of notifying all non-profits who haven't filed for 3 consecutive years that their tax exempt status is revoked.

- Ms. Burroughs announced: The **2010-2013 slate of officers** will be reported to the CAR executive committee by August 15. In response to a question, it was stated that membership is primarily a data gathering function which is no longer needed with the change to annual membership renewals. A new website coordinator is needed for CAR as soon as possible.
- *Through the Needle's Eye.* After discussion, and upon motion duly made by Ms. Osterberg, and seconded, it was **VOTED**: to approve a **\$500 donation** to the Tar River Chapter towards the EGA rental fee to bring *Through the Needle's Eye* to their area, to be paid when the fee is due.
