Fall Retreat 2012 Classes

Swan Box Skill Level: All Saturday, October 6, 2012 9:00 AM-4:00 PM Meg Thompson Shinall, Instructor Class size limited to 30



No ugly ducklings in this class! Only beautiful, graceful swans! Inspired by Ginnie Thompson's stitched cabinet, Meg has created a small box adorned with a cross stitched swan and lacy edge hardanger. Stitched with Ginnie Thompson Flower Threads on 20 count linen, this box is the perfect beginner's piece that will teach you all the techniques needed to create your own stitched heirloom memory box. The kit includes: instructions, linen, and threads for stitching your Swan Box. Students to bring usual stitching supplies, light and magnification (if needed), and sharp pointed scissors suitable for cutting hardanger.

Meg Shinall is a professional instructor, well known for her clear teaching techniques and patience. She has been in the needlework business since 1976 and has edited a number of needlework periodicals as well as submitting articles and designs for well-known publications such as EGA's Needle Arts.

Button, Button, Button, Who's Got the Button? Skill Level: All Saturday, October 6, 2012 8:30 AM - 11:30 AM Sue Osterberg, Instructor Class size limited to 24



Remember that game from elementary school? Well, you can play it now as an adult at fall retreat. Using a button stash, this woven, knotted bracelet is a fun and funky addition to any wardrobe. This is a creative way to use the buttons your mom saved in a box or jar.

The kit includes: waxed linen, buttons, written instructions. (large hole beads & toggle clasps will be available to purchase during class, but not necessary to complete the basic bracelet.) You may bring beads and clasps from your own stash. Students to bring colorless (clear) nail polish, scissors, tweezers, tray and/or bead mat, light and/or magnification as needed. Students are welcome to bring their own button stash and buttons to share with the class.

Sue Osterberg has been a member of EGA since 1992. When she & her husband retired to Hendersonville, NC fourteen years ago, she joined The Laurel chapter. She was the Carolinas Region's Dean of Faculty for six years. Has taught many chapter projects and Make It – Take It projects for the region. She has a BS in health education and a MS in nursing. She taught in public school for seven years, went back to school for nursing and retired after 20 years of Public Health nursing. She loves to craft by up cycling common items. Hence the button bracelet!
