From the Region Director

Howdy fellow stitchers,

It was good to see many of you at Fall Retreat. As always, it was inspiring to be with like minded people. I always enjoy visiting with region members and admiring the fantastic projects that accompany you.

In October, I represented the region at the fall board meetings in San Antonio prior to seminar. A lot was accomplished in those two days.

Monday hosted a strategic planning session with Core Value, a strategic planning company hired to help us thru the process. I wish to thank the chapter presidents and any other region members who received a survey prior to the meeting and responded. Those answers helped shape how this planning will be pursued and implemented.

After reviewing the survey results and determining our strategic goals, we broke into groups to develop a tag line and new mission statement for EGA. The tag line exercise proved to

be the quicker of the two and met with rapid consensus. The mission statement exercise was a bit more challenging to ensure any aspects we wished to include were there. An ad hoc committee met and finalized the statement. It was presented during the directors' meeting on Tuesday and approved.

The new statement is: "The mission of The Embroiderers' Guild of America is to inspire passion for the needle arts through education and the celebration of its heritage." The tag line is: "EGA: Where needle art lives." The new statement more accurately reflects where the organization is now plus it's much easier to remember.

The board was divided into committees to develop objectives to aid in the implementation of the strategic goals. The goals include expanding our online presence, a marketing campaign, a comprehensive membership recruitment and retention program, a fund development program, and development of an

efficient and effective operational plan. If any of you have an idea for any of these areas, please let me know. I'll be sure to pass them along to the appropriate committee.

Tuesday's session focused on business matters. The Phillips Estate is still in the court system awaiting resolution.

Carolinas Region, EGA Board of Directors Meeting 10 am Sunday September 13, 2015

Call to Order. Region Director Elizabeth Little called the meeting to order at 10:00 am, Sunday September 13, 2015 in Rock Hill, SC.

Quorum met with 14 of 17 Carolinas Region chapters present with voting members.

Region Seminar Updates: per Janet Noble, recap for June 2015 at Ridgecrest was 78 attended with 4 classes. There was an issue about overflow attendees having to be in buildings other than Rhododendron.

Old Business:

June Ridgecrest Board of Directors for 2015 minutes stand as presented. Motion made and approved to continue a region donation of \$300 to National's General Fund plus \$15 additional donation for each region chapter that donates at least \$15, up to a total of \$200. Local chapters must send proof of donation to Becky Buie by mid-December.

Margaret Wiesemann was elected to fill the remaining term of Education Coordinator.

Chapter Program Grant (formerly Educational Grant) is still available for 2015. Send requests to RD Elizabeth Little. Remember that the 20th Through the Needle's Eye Exhibit will be in our area Jan. 23-May 8, 2016. Make plans to go and check it out.

Time to Teach Program is being continued. Chapters can plan a program for children and with receipts receive up to \$50 back.

Other Business:

Nominating Committee: Positions on committee filled by Janine Bangs (two-year term), and Karla Gee (one-year term).

Financial Update: Becky Buie presented financial up date of operating expenses up to Fall Retreat 2015.

Outreach: Angie Fittro will coordinate this information.

Education Updates: Domestic Teacher Tour has money available from the Phillips Estate that will be used for a two day class taught by Marie Campbell on soutache beads and braids with date and location to be determined.

National Seminar 2017 Update: There will be no classes in June of 2017 at Stitchin' on the Ridge to finish preparations for National, but Region Meeting will be held.

New Business:

Ridgecrest for 2016: Dates are June 3-5, 2016. There will be 3 classes offered: Marie Campbell's Tierra Treasure (beading); Donna Olson's Summer Jewels (Hardanger); Anne Strite-Kurz's Soaring Sea Gull (Canvas embroidery).

Room reservations will need to be made by Feb. 29, 2016, to be in Rhondendron area. After that date, part of the block rooms may be unavailable.

In 2016, new Region Officers will have an orientation prior to Fall Retreat. Motion made and carried to clarify the subject of lodging in Policies and Procedures Manual, item M.4.a. to read: at one-half room rate.

Janet Noble presented a class on how to do the ort boxes that will be used as table favors at National in 2016. Chapters will be asked to decide how many boxes they can make from prepared forms. Any additional boxes needed will be made at Ridgecrest 2016. Also in connection with this matter, Sue Osterberg thanks all who brought floss to Fall Retreat and said that any more donations will be taken and used if brought to Ridgecrest 2016.

National Seminar Updates:

Stitching of the Logo (contest) for National Seminar 2017 deadline is Ridgecrest 2016. Other planning is underway. There will be a trip sponsored by CAR to see the 21st Through the Needle's Eye Exhibit. Volunteers will be needed. More to come.

For only \$30, you receive a pdf file of all four designs, including one from our very own Karla Gee. Sara Zander, Catherine Jordan, and Margaret Bendig are the other three designers. All proceeds support research for Alzheimers.

Another item is the possibility of a mega seminar with ANG. This is

Installation Chair: determines installer, acquires props as needed, draws up a master plan, confers with graphics chair, determines guest book, peoples' choice.

Receiving/Returning Chair: Jurying will be done electronically. This chair will be receiving for photography, then returning at the close of exhibit. The notebook will come from the registrar. Items are unwrapped, tagged, sorted. Provides supplies for handling and shipping. All items go to EGA at the close of exhibit.



A Region-wide contest to render the Blue Ridge Rendezvous logo in embroidery is being announced by the Seminar 2017 committee. The winning stitched piece will appear on the cover of the seminar brochure - the March 2017 issue of *NeedleArts* magazine.

The guidelines are simple:

- The logo can be stitched in any technique on any ground;
- Shape can be a square or rectangle approximately 5"x7", 6"x6", but no larger than 8"x8";
- There are 6 main colors (a shaded orange, four blues, and white), but because of the color printing process, there are more colors represented by DMC numbers to use as reference:
 - Salmon sky 608, 3340, 3779, 3855, 744
 - Blue mountains 825, 824, 3761, 519, 828

NOTE: Shiny metallic colors/thread should be avoided because these do not photograph well.

Deadline for submission is June 3, 2016 (Carolinas Region Seminar - Ridgecrest).

The winner will be chosen by members of the seminar committee. The stitched logo, along with all copyrights, becomes the property of the Carolinas Region until the conclusion of EGA Seminar 2017, at which time the stitched logo will be returned to its stitcher.

Scholarships/Awards

GA offers scholarships and awards to encourage study and excellence in needlework. Amounts awarded may vary each year. Carolinas Region, EGA, offers scholarships and awards to its members, as well.

For those new to EGA and/or to the Carolinas Region, descriptions of the various scholarships and awards are included on this page.

CRESSAward

he acronym, **CRESS**, stands for **C**arolinas **R**egion **E**mbroidery **S**tudy **S**cholarship. The Region offers a \$300 scholarship annually to a member for the purpose of embroidery study.
