

Special Class Offered: Braid & Beads Pendant Necklace - April 29-30, 2016

Marie Campbell, Designer

The *Braid & Beads Pendant Necklace* class presents an opportunity to try your hand at soutache embroidery.

We begin by attaching one, two, then three soutache braids to the mounted focal stone. We proceed to techniques for holding and sewing soutache, for beginning and ending braids, and for incorporating pearls in different sizes. The pendant is completed with a pinback with bail, an edge stitch of 11° seed beads, and a pearl tassel at center bottom. Two small pearl and soutache elements nestle in a chain of double St. Petersburg chain fastened with a gold finish box closure.

The palette ranges from silver, beige, gold, white, to black. **Level:** Beginner for soutache embroidery, some beading experience useful.

Pin or Pendant soutache braid and beads design: wear it with its St. Petersburg double chain necklace with more braid and pearl elements, or pin it on your lapel or hat. Design is 2 ½"w x 1 ¾" l. The necklace with pin/pendant is 23"

Materials provided: Braids, pearls, mounted teardrop crystal. Super Duos, Triangles, seed beads, silver 15° charlottes, 3' Fireline, crystal GP box closure, ball & socket closures, Nymo thread Size B, needles, Peltex, Ultrasuede®.

Materials Cost \$84

Supplies to bring: Scissors, beading pad, stitching light, magnifier if needed, beeswax or microcrystalline wax. E6000 adhesive

Bio: Retiring after thirty years teaching American culture and literature, Marie has since focused on creating fiber and bead art and is a Fiber Forum member. A beader for twenty-five years, Marie has taught national, region and chapter groups. Her beading classes provide a path to use as a springboard for the student's inspirations.

Have you taken a class from the Royal School of Needlework (RSN),

either at Hampton Palace or in the United States? If so, please contact me at cwiesemann@nc.rr.com. I am looking for someone who would like to share their RSN experience with the attendees at the Fall Retreat in Rock Hill.

2016 Group Correspondance Courses:

ach year the Carolinas Region sponsors three Group Correspondence courses for its members. The region will pay teaching fees (\$175 per group) and certain postage costs associated with the courses; participants will be responsible for the cost of the instruction booklet and their own supplies. There must be a minimum of five students (from Carolinas Region) and the maximum number of students is 20. Enrollment is on a 'first-come, first-served' basis.

Hostesses/Docents/Demos Chair: determines needs and duties of hostesses/docents/demonstrators. Seeks these volunteers. Works with graphics for ID ribbons. Develops schedules.

Graphics Chair: develops certificates, hostess ribbons. Works with publicity to design posters, flyers and announcements. Works with reception to design invitations, with installation chair to design labels and miscellaneous signs. Organizes the printing of above.


Reception Chair: formulates plan with exhibit EC. Creates guest list. Coordinates plans with exhibit facility. Develops hostess needs, issues invitations. Arranges for equipment/decorations. Writes thank you notes for all solicited merchandise and acknowledgments in catalog and/or Needle Arts.

Installation Chair: determines installer, acquires props as needed, draws up a master plan, confers with graphics chair, determines guest book, peoples' choice.

Receiving/Returning Chair: Jurying will be done electronically. This chair will be receiving for photography, then returning at the close of exhibit. The notebook will come from the registrar. Items are unwrapped, tagged, sorted. Provides supplies for handling and shipping. All items go to EGA at the close of exhibit.

Stitch the winning logo!

A Region-wide contest to render the Blue Ridge Rendezvous logo in embroidery is being announced by the Seminar 2017 committee. The winning stitched piece will appear on the cover of the seminar brochure - the March 2017 issue of *NeedleArts* magazine.

The guidelines are simple:

- The logo can be stitched in any technique on any ground;
- Shape can be a square or rectangle approximately 5"x7", 6"x6", but no larger than 8"x8";
- There are 6 main colors (a shaded orange, four blues, and white), but because of the color printing process, there are more colors represented by DMC numbers to use as reference:
 - Salmon sky 608, 3340, 3779, 3855, 744
 - Blue mountains 825, 824, 3761, 519, 828

NOTE: Shiny metallic colors/thread should be avoided because these do not photograph well.

Deadline for submission is June 3, 2016 (Carolinas Region Seminar - Ridgecrest).

The winner will be chosen by members of the seminar committee. The stitched logo, along with all copyrights, becomes the property of the Carolinas Region until the conclusion of EGA Seminar 2017, at which time the stitched logo will be returned to its stitcher.

A total of thirteen individuals may be acknowledged – one from each of EGA's regions, with the national recipient selected from among the region recipients. **Now is the time to nominate someone from your chapter:**

Nominations can either be emailed or mailed, and May 1st is the postmark deadline for nominations. A complete nomination shall include the following:

- 1. A brief cover letter not to exceed one page, explaining why the individual has been nominated.
- 2. A résumé, listing the nature and extent of service during the nominee's entire EGA membership.
- 3. A completed nomination form.
