From the Mountains to the Sea...

From the Region Director

EACH A BEGINNER:

I met a woman a while ago who was trying to learn some basic embroidery techniques; she had bought a kit and approached a Needlework Shop Who Shall Not Be Named. The person working there dismissed her with, "We don't teach beginners." Now that is just sad. And stupid. Who does that Needlework Shop Who Shall Not Be Named think will be their future customers?

Sometimes, I've run across people who think members of the EGA must all be elite stitchers who look down their noses at people who only know how to do cross-stitch. We have to do everything we can to convince others that what they do is still our beloved embroidery, even if it is a stamped cross-stitch kit they bought at Hobby Lobby! Many of us started out doing stamped crossstitch and stamped surface embroidery kits, and then became interested in learning more and more until, now, there is no stopping us. I still remember reading my first EGA Education Catalogue – I had never heard of many of the techniques and I thought or nué was a typo! I decided that evening that I would read and experiment and learn for myself – EGA made that possible for me and we need to offer that same opportunity to others.

When someone sees you stitching in public/a waiting room/a basketball gym or where ever, encourage their questions and, if the opportunity presents itself, offer to show them how to do it. You might be inspiring the next hot needlework designer/teacher!

Mini-Class 1 • Red Clover by Katherine Diuguid

Taking inspiration from Victorian botanical illustrations, this design celebrates the beauty of the lowly Red Clover. Incorporating variegated threads and stretched metal threads with traditional embroidery and padding techniques gives this design a unique blend of traditional and non-traditional appeal.

Technique: Traditional and Creative EmbroideryProficiency: All levelsKit Cost: \$70 (Aida Cloth), or \$75 (Silk Dupioni)Design Area: 4" x 8"Kit Contents: Ground fabric of choice with backing fabric and design outline.Valdani variegated cotton threads, gilt smooth purl, gilt pearl purl, needles and felt.





Mini-Class 2 • Summertime Swan by Cara Hayes

Summertime Swan is a calling or business card holder that features Rhodes stitch and crescent stitches to form a swan in water. A blackwork pattern forms branches while bead embellishment creates wisteria blossoms hanging overhead. The project uses 18-count mono canvas, a variety of threads, and has a geometric design on the reverse side. A finished edge is formed with the blanket stitch. Students learn how to cut away a small rectangle of canvas and finish that edge to create a space through which a ribbon can be passed to facilitate dispensing the card. There are advanced compensation methods presented.

Technique: CanvasProficiency: IntermediateKit Cost: \$36Design Area: 2-3/4" x 4-1/4"Kit Contents: 18-count canvas, DMC° pearl cottons and floss, Weeks Dye Works° fibers, MillHill beads, ribbon, metal decorative bead, tapestry and beading needles

Mini-Class 3 • Bands and Swirls by Dana Watson

This beginner class is a great introduction to the art of Temari, an ancient Japanese embroidery technique used on a spherical form. Appealing for both its orderly geometrical divisions and endless room for artistic variation, this can be a highly addictive hobby. This particular design teaches basic skills such as applying guidelines, the foundational wrapped bands technique, and the always fun swirl stitch.

Technique: TemariProficiency: All levelsKit Cost: \$20Design Area: 3" round (approximate)Kit Contents: 1 Temari needle, 1 Temari base, 4 skeins pearl cotton, paper measuringstrips. (Students are encouraged to bring ball-head pins and scissors)





Mini-Class 4 • *Floating Pearl or Gemstone Earrings* by Carol Wilcox Wells Several years ago I came up with a new beading stitch I call Granulated Chain and have been exploring its possibilities ever since. It is simple to do once the technique is mastered and the supplies needed are something we all have – round seed beads. As we will only have 3 hours together, the Floating Pearl Earrings will be a good introduction to the stitch.

Technique: Beading **Kit Cost:** \$30

Proficiency: Intermediate Design Area: earrings

Kit Contents: 15/0 Japanese seed beads, 11/0 Japanese seed beads - one or two colors, 8 mm freshwater pearls or gem stones, gold-filled or sterling silver ear wires. Gold-filled or sterling silver chain, thread, 1 beading needle.

Beaded Nametag

Carolinas Region, EGA Board of Directors Meeting Sunday, September 25, 2016

Call to Order. Region Director Elizabeth Little called the meeting to order at 10:00 am on Sunday, September 25, 2016, at Rock Hill, SC. **Quorum** was 13 of 16 chapters which met necessary number. Minutes from Ridgecrest 2016 approved.

Financial update: Per Becky Buie, Region Treasurer, 2016 Ridgecrest Seminar ended \$945 in the black, with \$1377.33 remaining in our share of the Phillips Estate to be used by December of 2018, as CAR's request for an extension on the use of the money was granted. **General Business:** Per Janet Noble, Ridgecrest 2016 had 68 attendees of which 5 were first timers. Class participants were 35 with the remainder in studio time/work party time.

Fall Retreat had 43 participants with 9 taking the bracelet classes; 12, the scissors fob class; the remaining involved in studio time or working on projects for National Seminar.

New Business: Because Ridgecrest 2017 and Fall Retreat 2017 are so close to National EGA meeting in Ashville, NC, it was decided to have studio time with a teacher there to help with projects at Ridgecrest and have a unique pin to cover this occasion. There is something special in the works for the Friday at Ridgecrest, so stay tuned. There will be more to come on the 2017 Fall Retreat.

Members are being asked to find projects that fit the category for Ridgecrest 2017 exhibit: Something I started at a National Seminar, even if it's unfinished, especially if worked on during the last time our region hosted National Seminar in 2002 when the theme was Moonlight and Magnolias. There will opportunity baskets at Ridgecrest.

The fees for Ridgecrest 2017 will be \$50 if paid before February 28, 2017, and \$75 after that date until Ridgecrest to ensure that the numbers are there to keep CAR's place in the reservation line. Room and meal plans will go up some. CAR 's fees for Ridgecrest will return to usual levels for 2018.

At this point, Fall Retreat will be Fall Retreat Lite sometime in late October 2017. There will probably be something planned for Friday evening, a make it/take it class and the Fall business meeting Saturday afternoon.

Education Chair Margaret Wiesemann updated GCCs saying that 2 were ongoing at this time. Three new classes were introduced with various levels of expertise, costs and pre-working. The classes are Maharajah's Elephant, an intermediate offering for canvas work; Hardanger, a beginner level counted drawn thread offering; and Meadow Melody, an intermediate level offering in surface embroidery. **Outreach** had 11 chapters participating per Elizabeth Little.

Elections were held for new officers to cover 3-year term 2017-2020. The new officers are as follows; Janet Noble, Region Director; Karla Gee, Assistant Region Director; Elizabeth Little, Secretary; Treasurer, Sydney Mace; Education Coordinator, Margaret Wiesemann; new Nominating Committee member Julia Tison. Motion carried.

Old Business: CAR was asked to donate money to the 21st Through the Needle's Eye. Janet Noble made the motion by stating "I, Janet Noble, move that the CAR donate a minimum of \$1000 to EGA to support the launch of the *21st Through the Needle's Eye* Exhibit; the individual chapters send their donation to the CAR Treasurer NLT 1 December 2016 and CAR will donate the difference NLT 15 December 2016. Motion seconded by Rosemary Kostansek. Vote called for and carried.

Other Business: Liz Baumgart was the recipient of the Roxy Hodgkin Award and Becky Buie, the recipient of the CRESS Award. Congratulations to Sue Osterberg for completing the Master Craftsman in Beading. She is the first one in the Carolinas Region to finish. Also, congratulations to Elizabeth Little for finishing Step 2 in Counted Thread.

Pat Carson is asking for EGA chapters to help with donating a minimum of 500 handmade Christmas ornaments that will go to school children in Louisiana who lost everything due to flooding.

Approval of 2017 \$125 per chapter for Program Grant; Approval of 2017 donation to National of \$300, plus \$15 matching donation up to \$200 additional; Approval of 2017 of \$50 per chapter for Time to Teach reimbursement grant.

National Seminar 2017 Update: Julie Anderson and Sue Osterberg, merchandise offered for sale at Fall Retreat and in Alexandria at 2016's National EGA Seminar. Profits from National Seminar are divided one half to region hosting seminar and one half to National EGA. Everyone who worked at Ridgecrest and Fall Retreat to help get things organized and going were thanked by Sue Osterberg.

Reminder that there will be usage fees such as facility fee so that there will be space to use at the Crown Plaza. Booking and reservations will open in first part of November.

Also being worked on are short classes on the Tuesday August 15, 2017, before everything officially begins.
