# **From the Region Director**

#### CHAPTER BY-LAWS REVIEW.

Every chapter within the Carolinas Region must review and sign updated chapter by-laws during calendar year 2018. In a nutshell:

- get a copy of your existing bylaws,
- get a copy of the bylawstemplate (email Becky Buie at <u>blbuie@sc.rr.com</u>),
- insert the updated information specific to your chapter into the template and save it,
- send it to all chapter members to read, discuss, ask questions, etc.,
- wait at least 30 days,
- vote at a chapter meeting to approve the draft bylaws,
- then ask Becky for the next step (it goes to the National Bylaws Committee for their review).

Meanwhile, the Region Executive Committee will be doing the same thing with our Region bylaws. We hope to send our draft to all of you no later than 30 April 2018 so we can (I hope!) approve our draft during the Region meeting at Ridgecrest on 3 June 2018. If your chapter has questions about any of this, contact Becky Buie (our region's Bylaws Chair).

#### FALL RETREAT/PHILLIPS ES-TATE EDUCATIONAL GRANT.

The Carolinas Region still has \$1,377.63 remaining from the \$5,000 educational grant provided by the Gay Montague Phillips bequest to EGA. The Board has selected a teacher who will present a two -day class followed by a one-day class—details will follow as soon as we finalize the contract. We are planning the two-day class to be taught on Thurs-Fri, 25-26 Oct 2018, and the one-day class to be taught on Sat, 27 Oct 2018 (as part of our Fall Retreat). You can choose to sign up for both, or for either one. As usual, you will be able to see both finished projects during *Stitchin' on the Ridge* in June.

Fall Retreat will feature a 3-hour Make-It, Take-It, Teach-It class from 6-9 pm Friday night, the option to take either the one-day class OR Sit 'n Stitch Saturday, a Mini-Merchandise Night Saturday night, and the Region meeting Sunday morning (ending at 12 noon).

#### Carolinas Region, EGA – Board of Directors Meeting Sunday, September 25, 2016 – CORRECTED

**Call to Order.** Region Director Elizabeth Little called the meeting to order at 10:?? on Sunday, Sept. 25, 2015, at Rock Hill, SC.

Quorum was 13 of 16 chapters which met necessary number.

Minutes from Ridgecrest 2016 approved.

**Financial update**: Per Becky Buie, Region Treasurer, 2016 Ridgecrest Seminar ended \$945 in the black, with \$1377.33 remaining in our share of the Phillips Estate to be used by December of 2018, as CAR's request for an extension to use the money was granted.

**General Business**: Per Janet Noble, Ridgecrest 2016 has 68 attendees of which 5 were first timers. Class participants were 35 with the remainder in studio time/work party time.

Fall Retreat had 43 participants with 9 taking the bracelet classes; 12, the scissors fob class; the remaining involved in studio time or working on projects for National Seminar.

#### New Business:

Because Ridgecrest 2017 and Fall Retreat 2017 are so close to National EGA meeting in Ashville, NC, it was decided to have studio time with a teacher there to help with projects at Ridgecrest and have a unique pin to cover this occasion. There will be more to come on the 2017 Fall Retreat. There is something special in the works for the Friday at Ridgecrest, so stay tuned.

At this point, Fall Retreat will be Fall Retreat Lite sometime in late October 2017. There will probably be something planned for Friday evening, a make it/take it class and the Fall business meeting Saturday afternoon.

Members are being asked to find projects that fit the category for Ridgecrest 2017 exhibit: *Something I started at a National Seminar,* even if it's unfinished, especially if worked on during the last time our region hosted National Seminar in 2002 when the theme was *Moonlight and Magnolias*.

There will opportunity baskets at Ridgecrest.

The fees for Ridgecrest 2017 will be \$50 if paid before February 28, 2017, and \$75 after that date until Ridgecrest to ensure that the numbers are there to keep CAR's place in the reservation line. Room and meal plans will go up some. CAR 's fees for Ridgecrest will return to usual levels for 2018.

Education Chair Margaret Wiesemann updated GCC's saying that 2 were ongoing at this time. Three new classes were introduced with various levels of expertise, costs and pre-working. The classes are Maharajah's Elephant, an intermediate offering for canvas work; Hardanger, a beginner level counted drawn thread offering; and Meadow Melody, an intermediate level offering in surface embroidery. Outreach had 11 chapters participating per Elizabeth Little.

Elections were held for new officers to cover a 3-year term 2017-2020. The new officers are as follows; Janet Noble, Region Director; Karla Gee, Assistant Region Director; Elizabeth Little, Secretary; Treasurer, Sydney Mace; Education Coordinator, Margaret Wiesemann; new Nominating Committee member Julia Tison. Motion carried.

**Old Business:** CAR was asked to donate money to the **21st Through the Needle's Eye**. Janet Noble made the motion by stating "I, Janet Noble, move that the CAR donate a minimum of \$1000 to EGA to support the launch of the 21st Through the Needle's Eye Exhibit; the individual chapters send their donation to the CAR Treasurer NLT 1 December 2016 and CAR will donate the difference NLT 15 December 2016. Motion seconded by Rosemary Kostansek. Vote called for and carried.

**Other Business**: Liz Baumgart was the recipient of the Roxy Hodgkin Award and Becky Buie, the recipient of the CRESS Award.

Congratulations to Sue Osterberg for completing the Master Craftsman in Beading. She is the first one in the Carolinas Region to finish. Also, congratulations to Elizabeth Little for finishing Step 2 in Counted Thread.

Pat Carson is asking for EGA chapters to help with donating a minimum of 500 handmade Christmas ornaments that will go to school children in Louisiana who lost everything due to flooding.

National Seminar 2017 Update:

Per Julie Anderson and Sue Osterberg, merchandise offered for sale at Fall Retreat and in Alexandria at 2016's National EGA Seminar. Profits from National Seminar are divided one half to region hosting seminar and one half to National EGA. Everyone who worked at Ridgecrest and Fall Retreat to help get things organized and going were thanked by Sue Osterberg.

Reminder that there will be usage fees such as facility fee so that there will be space to use at the Crown Plaza. Booking and reservations will open in first part of November.

Also, being worked on are short classes to be held on the Tuesday August 15, 2017, before everything officially begins.

### Board Meeting – Carolinas Region, EGA

October 27, 2017

**Call to Order**. Region Director Janet Noble called the meeting to order at 1:00PM on Friday, October 27, 2017 at Hampton Inn, Rock Hill, SC.

**Present**. Region Director Janet Noble, Secretary Elizabeth Little, Treasurer Sydney Mace, Education Coordinator Margaret Wiesemann, Bylaws Chair Becky Buie, and Carole Overton, Assistant Region Director nominee.

Quorum. There being delegates from more than one-third (6) of member chapters present, a quorum was present.

Minutes. The minutes of June 4, 2017 were approved as submitted.

Assistant Region Director. In Ms. Gee's absence, Ms. Noble reported:

- 1. Ms. Gee has resigned for health reasons.
- 2. Janine Bangs, nominating committee chair, presented Carole Overton to fill the ARD opening. After discussion and without objection, Ms. Overton was elected.
- 3. Stitchin' on the Ridge 2018:
  - A. June 1-3, 2018 at Ridgecrest Conference Center.
  - B. 4 classes, Studio Time, and Sit 'n Stitch offered
    - i) Terri Bay Flowers in the Snow
    - ii) Jennifer Riefenberg Color Play
    - iii) Laura Smith Batik to Stitch
    - iv) Amee Sweet-McNamara Leaf Twirl Hoop Earrings
    - V) Marion Scoular Studio Time
  - C. Registration numbers will be evaluated and classes may be cancelled due to low participation numbers
  - D. Fees
    - i) Classes/Studio Time: \$165, with \$15 discount for early registration
    - ii) Sit 'n Stitch: \$75, no discount
    - iii) Merchandise night/Teacher showcase tables: \$25 per table
    - iv) Chapters/Region members have preference for merchandise tables thru end of registration, then open to anyone
    - v) Early registration ends February 28, 2018
  - E. We will continue with the Stitchin' on the Ridge lapel pins. Ideas for a new logo design should be given to Ms. Noble or Ms. Overton. We will also be changing vendors.

#### Treasurer's Report. Ms. Mace:

- 1. Briefed the financial reports. Stitchin'Lite had a loss but it was expected due to the change in format. The mini classes held in conjunction with Seminar 2017 reported a gain. The two region events netted a profit for the region.
- 2. All 16 active chapters have paid their region dues.
- 3. 5 chapters have not requested the program grant to date. Request must be to Janet by December 15, 2017.
- 4. Chapter match portion of EGA General Fund donation copy of acknowledgement from EGA must be received by Ms. Mace by December 15, 2017.
- 5. The Executive Committee recommends investing the remaining Phillips Fund Grant in a money market account, currently earning 1% interest. After discussion and without objection, the motion carried.

#### Education Coordinator. Ms. Wiesemann reported:

**Outreach**. Ms. Little presented report. Additions are: Millwood – 8 Habitat Samplers and Beginning Embroidery at the Museum of Art; Low Country – Habitat Samplers.

Newsletter. Ms. Barker would like items for the newsletter to be sent to her by November 10, 2017.

#### Unfinished Business.

Ms. Noble reminded the Board of Directors that \$1,377.63 remains from the Phillips' Grant. The Executive Committee has suggested using these funds for a two day class in conjunction with Fall Retreat 2018. Requests for proposals will be sent. If anyone has a specific teacher they would like to receive a request, please send it to Ms. Noble or Ms. Wiesemann.

Ms. Noble also reported the Phillips' Estate has been settled. EGA has received half of the settlement in cash with the other half in a promissory note.

#### New Business. Ms. Noble reported:

1. The Executive Committee recommends increasing the program grant from \$125 to \$150 effective for 2018. After discussion and without objection, the motion carried.

2. There will be no region sponsored group correspondence courses in 2018.

3. Janine Bangs is rotating off the nominating committee. Sallie Folk is nominated to fill the vacancy. After discussion and without objection, Ms. Folk was elected.

4. Bylaws for the Carolinas Region and all its chapters are due for review/approval in 2018. Becky Buie, By-laws chair, is the contact/liaison for the chapters and region.

- 5. August 2017 national board meeting, Ms. Noble reported:
  - A. Sheey Marketing proposed a new EGA logo that has been accepted. The original logo will be renamed "The Legacy Logo." The organization name will remain the same. The new logo will be issued in conjunction with a new website.
- 6. Outreach ideas.
  - A. Ms. Noble reminded the group that kissing pillows aren't an EGA sponsored program. The region can't spon sor them but individual chapters or members are welcome to participate.
  - B. Paraclete is an Arizona group that collects cross stitching supplies. They are repackaged and sent to Third World countries, shelters, schools in poverty areas, etc. If anyone has supplies they would like to donate, bring them to Ridgecrest and the region will ship them to Paraclete.
  - C. Fundraising ideas submitted to date include: hard plastic hinged project cases in 3 sizes and project labels. Other ideas are welcome. Please submit them to Ms. Noble or Ms. Overton.
- 7. Ms. Noble has enjoyed her chapter visits to date. She encourages any chapter she has not visited to contact her to schedule a visit.
- 8. A committee to research a possible new venue for Stitchin' on the Ridge is requested. Please let Ms. Noble know if interested in serving.
- Ms. Mace presented the 2018 budget. After discussion and without objection, the budget was accepted as printed.
