The FIRST BIG CHANGE is that I will resign as Region Director effective the end of the Board of Directors meeting on Friday, 1 June 2018 (at Ridgecrest) and Carole Overton (Aiken Stitchin' Belles) will assume the role of Region Director for the remainder of my term in October 2019.

I will miss being your RD after that date, but it's for a very exciting reason: I will be on the slate of new national EGA officers – as President – up for election at the annual meeting on Thursday, 4 October 2018 (during the national Seminar in Louisville, KY). And, just like you can't remain a Senator if you're elected President, I can't remain a Region Director. Carole and I have been working for several weeks to ensure we have a smooth transition of responsibilities and we decided it would be better to make the switch sooner rather than at the last mi-

nute. I will always be a phone call/ email away any time there is a question or a need for background information.

Replacing the Region Director with the Assistant Region Director does not require an election; our region bylaws mandates this as an automatic action. However, we need to elect a replacement for Carole as ARD to fill her remaining term (also until October 2019).

We have (this is the **SECOND BIG CHANGE**) other region officers who are resigning or changing positions and their replacements must also be elected by the Board of Directors. Sydney Mace is resigning as region Treasurer and Elizabeth Little has volunteered to move into that job. Since Elizabeth is imminently qualified to be the Treasurer, this is beneficial to all; however, it leaves the region Secretary's job vacant. Cathie Barker has agreed to fill the Secretary position for the rest of Elizabeth's term, but she will need to be replaced as the region Newsletter/ Website Chair position.

Therefore, at the Board meeting on 1 June 2018, we will vote to approve:

- Elizabeth Little as the new Treasurer and
- Cathie Barker as the new Secretary.

The region Nominating Committee is now looking for <u>two volunteers</u> to fill the remaining terms for:

- Assistant Region Director (requires Board of Directors approval)
- Newsletter/Website Chair (does NOT require Board of Directors approval)

The THIRD BIG CHANGE concerns our Region Seminar. As long as most of us can remember, we have held Stitchin' on the Ridge at the Ridgecrest Conference Center just east of Asheville. This year's Seminar. however, is the last time we can have it at this location, so we are actively seeking a completely new location (or locations) to hold our future Seminars. And, no, it's not because of anything we have done; it is because the leadership of Ridgecrest has decided to limit bookings to faith-based organizations, and The Embroiderers' Guild of America does not meet that requirement.

We are working with Karen Andreassen, the Helms-Briscoe event planner who helped with our 2017

National Seminar, to find one or more different sites that can meet our needs. In response to those of you who have asked for the region seminar to move to a new location within the region, we are considering facilities across North and South Carolina; we are also considering rotating the seminar location.

The bad news is we are going to experience serious "sticker shock" since the prices of commercial hotels and facilities are considerably higher than we are used to paying at Ridgecrest, and this will necessitate higher registration fees for you. To counteract that, we have decided to hold a formal seminar, with nationally recognized teachers and classes, on even-numbered years (starting in 2020) alternating with a stitching retreat organized for the odd-numbered years (starting in 2019). A retreat would enable us to hold a general meeting and come together to stitch and socialize but require a minimal registration fee.

Therefore, if you have never experienced the magic of Ridgecrest, this June's seminar is your last chance. There is still time to register, but you must act quickly. I hope to see you there!

Carolinas Region, EGA – Board of Directors Meeting Sunday, September 25, 2016 – CORRECTED (in red)

Call to Order. Region Director Elizabeth Little called the meeting to order at 10:02 on Sunday, Sept. 25, 2015, at Rock Hill, SC.

Quorum was 13 of 16 chapters which met necessary number.

Minutes from Ridgecrest 2016 approved.

Financial update: Per Becky Buie, Region Treasurer, 2016 Ridgecrest Seminar ended \$945 in the black, with \$1377.33 remaining in our share of the Phillips Estate to be used by December of 2018, as CAR's request for an extension to use the money was granted.

General Business: Per Janet Noble, Ridgecrest 2016 has 68 attendees of which 5 were first timers. Class participants were 35 with the remainder in studio time/work party time.

Fall Retreat had 43 participants with 9 taking the bracelet classes; 12, the scissors fob class; the remaining involved in studio time or working on projects for National Seminar.

New Business:

Because Ridgecrest 2017 and Fall Retreat 2017 are so close to National EGA meeting in Ashville, NC, it was decided to have studio time with a teacher there to help with projects at Ridgecrest and have a unique pin to cover this occasion. There will be more to come on the 2017 Fall Retreat. There is something special in the works for the Friday at Ridgecrest, so stay tuned.

At this point, Fall Retreat will be Fall Retreat Lite sometime in late October 2017. There will probably be something planned for Friday evening, a make it/take it class and the Fall business meeting Saturday afternoon.

Members are being asked to find projects that fit the category for Ridgecrest 2017 exhibit: *Something I started at a National Seminar*, even if it's unfinished, especially if worked on during the last time our region hosted National Seminar in 2002 when the theme was *Moonlight and Magnolias*.

There will opportunity baskets at Ridgecrest.

The fees for Ridgecrest 2017 will be \$50 if paid before February 28, 2017, and \$75 after that date until Ridgecrest to ensure that the numbers are there to keep CAR's place in the reservation line. Room and meal plans will go up some. CAR 's fees for Ridgecrest will return to usual levels for 2018.

Education Chair Margaret Wiesemann updated GCC's saying that 2 were ongoing at this time. Three new classes were introduced with various levels of expertise, costs and pre-working. The classes are Maharajah's Elephant, an intermediate offering for canvas work; Hardanger, a beginner level counted drawn thread offering; and Meadow Melody, an intermediate level offering in surface embroidery.

Outreach had 11 chapters participating per Elizabeth Little.

Elections were held for new officers to cover a 3-year term 2017-2020. The new officers are as follows; Janet Noble, Region Director; Karla Gee, Assistant Region Director; Elizabeth Little, Secretary; Treasurer, Sydney Mace; Education Coordinator, Margaret Wiesemann; new Nominating Committee member Julia Tison. Motion carried.

Old Business: CAR was asked to donate money to the 21st Through the Needle's Eye. Janet Noble made the motion by stating "I, Janet Noble, move that the CAR donate a minimum of \$1000 to EGA to support the launch of the 21st Through the Needle's Eye Exhibit; the individual chapters send their donation to the CAR Treasurer NLT 1 December 2016 and CAR will donate the difference NLT 15 December 2016. Motion seconded by Rosemary Kostansek. Vote called for and carried.

Other Business: Liz Baumgart was the recipient of the Roxy Hodgkin Award and Becky Buie, the recipient of the CRESS Award.

Congratulations to Sue Osterberg for completing the Master Craftsman in Beading. She is the first one in the Carolinas Region to finish. Also, congratulations to Elizabeth Little for finishing Step 2 in Counted Thread.

Pat Carson is asking for EGA chapters to help with donating a minimum of 500 handmade Christmas ornaments that will go to school children in Louisiana who lost everything due to flooding.

National Seminar 2017 Update:

Per Julie Anderson and Sue Osterberg, merchandise offered for sale at Fall Retreat and in Alexandria at 2016's National EGA Seminar. Profits from National Seminar are divided one half to region hosting seminar and one half to National EGA. Everyone who worked at Ridgecrest and Fall Retreat to help get things organized and going were thanked by Sue Osterberg.

Reminder that there will be usage fees such as facility fee so that there will be space to use at the Crown Plaza. Booking and reservations will open in first part of November.

Also, being worked on are short classes to be held on the Tuesday August 15, 2017, before everything officially begins.

After discussion and with no objection, the region approves offering a set of 4 mini classes in conjunction with Seminar 2017.

We each learn in different ways and for our own reasons. I personally was drawn to EGA early in my stitching career by the opportunity to learn and commune with other stitchers. I yearned to increase my knowledge and was curious to figure out "how did they do that?". No matter what brings you to the table, whether it is to learn a new technique, follow your favorite designer/teacher, or just to have an excuse to spend more time stitching with your friends, EGA has an educational opportunity for you.

Creating the opportunity to take a class can be as simple as filling out an application or sending an email.

The CRESS Award is a \$300 scholarship that is awarded annually and is good for ANY embroidery class.

You only need be a member of the Carolinas Region and submit the application by May 1st to me.

The Roxie Hodgkin Scholarship covers the registration fee and kit cost for the annual Region Seminar in the spring. You only need be a member of the Carolinas Region and to check off the necessary box on your seminar registration.

The Chapter Program Grant is available annually to each chapter in the Carolinas region. Obtaining the \$150 grant is as easy as emailing the Region Director with the request. Why not try that interesting GCC or Lightening Round being offered? Put it toward a teacher or an interesting speaker.

We have many wonderful teach-

ers residing in the Carolinas Region. Why not use The Chapter Program Grant towards having a class? If you need assistance contacting an instructor or need an idea for a class, please reach out. I would love to help.

I encourage you all to apply for the different opportunities listed above. Take that class, learn that technique, and stitch what makes you happy. And when you do....send me an email, show me the pics, and share your love for what you stitch.
