SAVE THE DATES! Carolinas Region will hold its first-ever *Spring* Retreat on May 31 – June 2, 2019, at the Mountain Lodge and Conference Center, 42 McMurray Road, Flat Rock, NC 28731. We are still working out the details of the event, but we can tell you a little about the venue (https://mountainlodgeflatrock.com/).

The Lodge is located at exit 53 on I-26. There is ample parking in a flat lot right outside the Lodge and there are only a few small steps to enter the building, so limited walking is required. All activities will take place in the lodge itself.

In the interest of offering a lowcost event, we will not provide any meals at this retreat. However, the Lodge provides a free hot breakfast bar, and each room has a kitchenette with a full refrigerator, microwave, sink, and 2-burner cooktop (a few rooms even have a full stove with oven), so you may choose to bring your own food if you do not want to take advantage of the wonderful restaurants in the Hendersonville area.

The location is only 15 minutes or so from *Sandy's X-Stitch on the Go* and only about 40 minutes from *Sassy Jack's Stitchery*.

The retreat starts on Friday night with an outdoor reception with cash bar, in a secluded area with a lovely waterfall as the backdrop.

We are calling this retreat "Reconnecting on the Ridge" because we want to encourage you to reconnect with the Hendersonville area, with your CAR friends, and with your unfinished EGA projects (just a suggestion about what to bring to work on!). We hope to offer several optional events in addition to the chance to stitch with your friends and to buy tickets for our popular chapter opportunity baskets.

The weekend will end with our Board of Directors meeting on Sunday morning.

CAR Workshop/Fall Retreat, October 2018 in Rock Hill, SC

Time is running out! The Carolinas Region is sponsoring two backto-back events at the end of October in Rock Hill, SC. On October 25-26, Kurdy Biggs will teach her beautiful canvas box, *Crème de la Crème*, for our 2-day fall workshop. There is no registration fee for this class, but there is a kit fee of \$130.

The CAR Fall Retreat will run from Friday evening, October 26, to Sunday, October 28, with a "sit and stitch" format. In addition, on Saturday, Celeste Chalasani will teach her stunning stumpwork piece, Calla Lilies on North Bank Road. There is a \$50 class fee and a \$40 kit fee for this class.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: Registrations must be postmarked or emailed by August 1, 2018. Due to space limitations, class sizes are limited for both of the above classes. We will therefore use a lottery system if the registration exceeds class limits. We will notify registrants as to whether or not they will be in the class after that date.

On Saturday night, Margaret Wiesemann, our Education Coordinator, will teach an optional "Make It, Take It, Teach It" class for a \$5 kit fee. Bring your favorite duct tape to personalize your "Project Safe" that you will learn how to make specifically to fit one of your own projects.

The retreat will end, as usual, on Sunday morning with our Board of Directors meeting.

Carolinas Region, EGA – Board of Directors Meeting Ridgecrest Conference Center, Ridgecrest, NC, Friday, June 1, 2018

Call to Order. Region Director Janet Noble called the meeting to order at 3:00 PM at the Ridgecrest Conference Center, Ridgecrest, NC.

Present. Region Director Janet Noble, Assistant Region Director Carole Overton, Secretary Elizabeth Little, and Education Coordinator Margaret Wiesemann.

Also present. Assistant Region Director nominee Cindi Lemkau, Secretary nominee Cathie Baker, and Bylaws Chair Becky Buie.

Quorum. There being delegates from more than one-third (6) chapters present, a quorum was present.

Minutes. Without objection, the minutes of October 27, 2017 were approved as submitted.

Assistant Region Director. Ms. Overton reported:

- 1. Stitchin' on the Ridge 2018
 - A. Fifty-seven attendees
 - B. First Timers will have a rhinestone sticker added to their nametag
- 2. Stitchin' on the Ridge 2019
 - A. Executive Committee has opted to go to odd year retreats and even year seminar, effective 2019.
 - B. Site visits were made to several venues this weekend. Based on the visit, Mountain Lodge seems to fit our needs best. Plans are to pursue a contract for this venue.
 - C. No pins will be made for retreat years. Send any objections to the Executive Committee for reconsideration.
- 3. Seminar 2020
 - A. Working with HelmsBriscoe to secure a location tentatively between Winston-Salem, NC and Raleigh, NC
 - B. Based on a show of hands, Memorial Day weekend is to be added as a possible weekend
 - C. New seminar pin design will be needed once location and name are known

Treasurer's Report. Ms. Little reported

- 1. The financial statements for calendar 2018.
- 2. The 2017 audit report. After discussion and without objection, the audit report was accepted as presented.
- 3. Not all chapters have requested the 2018 Chapter Program Grant. There are still funds available. Send request to the Region Director for approval.

Education Coordinator. Ms. Wiesemann reported

- 1. Fall Workshop, October 25 & 26, 2018
 - A. Crème de la Crème box, Kurdy Biggs, teacher
 - B. \$130 kit fee. Phillips' grant will pay teaching and travel fees
- 2. Fall Retreat, October 26-28, 2018
 - A. Calla Lillies on the North Bank Road, Celeste Chalasani, teacher
 - B. \$50 teaching fee, \$40 kit fee, and \$10 registration fee for this class
 - C. Sit and Stitch will be \$10 registration fee.
 - D. Margaret Wiesemann will teach Project Carrying Cases as the make-it/take-it/teach-it class. \$5 kit fee. Participants will supply their own duct tape for the construction.
 - E. Sunday Morning Chapter Sales 9:30 AM, Board meeting at 10:00 AM

Both classes will employ a lottery if filled by August 1, 2018. If fees aren't paid by September 1, 2018, your place will be forfeited and offered to the next person on the waiting list.

There were no entries for CRESS this year.

There have been no notifications of Master Craftsman steps completed.

Region Director. Ms. Noble reported

- 1. Paraclete. Donations are still being accepted by this organization. Ms. Noble will send the contact information to any chapter if needed.
- 2. President's Project. Leslie Gagliardi's goal of \$15,000 for Alzheimer's research over her three year term has been met.
- 3. Longest Day Stitch-in. Stitch in Public Day, on or around June 21, 2018. This is to raise Alzheimer's awareness and possibly additional donations for research. This is not an EGA sponsored activity.

Unfinished Business. Phillips' Grant money will be fully used after the Fall Workshop. Final report will be sent to national at that time to show compliance.

New Business.

Change in Officers. After discussion and upon recommendation from the Executive Committee, it was VOTED: that the board of directors authorize Sydney Mace to continue as a signatory on all bank accounts and the money market account until such time as new documents can be executed at the banks.

Bylaws. Ms. Buie reported

- 1. Process has begun.
- Clause for "removing officer for cause". After discussion, it was decided to include this in the bylaw revision
- 3. Number of voting members at the Board meeting (2 versus 1).
 - A. After discussion and upon recommendation from the Bylaws Committee, it was VOTED that region representatives be elected by their chapter.
 - B. After discussion and upon recommendation from the Bylaws Committee, it was VOTED that Carolinas Region chapter presidents and Region Representatives have voting privileges.
- 4. These changes will be incorporated into the draft and sent to Becky Autry, national bylaws review committee chair for review.
- 5. Chapters must also complete the bylaw review in 2018.

Ms. Overton shared ideas for fundraising items. She has various project boxes that could have a decal added for a nominal investment cost. She also shared the idea of a

calendar featuring stitching from region members. Based on feedback this weekend, Ms. Overton will follow up to determine costs, etc.

Designs are needed for both the ¼ page region ad in the Diamond Jubilee Handbook as well as a new CAR pin based on the new EGA logo.

Election of Interim Officers.

Ms. Noble stated, "For the record, I, Janet Noble, will be resigning as region director, which resignation will take effect immediately after adjournment of this meeting. As provided in Article IV Officers, Section 4 of the Carolinas Region Bylaws, Assistant Region Director Carole Overton will automatically become region director."

Ms. Katrina Lawrimore, Nominating Committee Chair, presented the officer candidates. Cindi Lemkau, Assistant Region Director, Cathie Barker, Secretary, and Elizabeth Little, Treasurer. There being no objection, the slate was elected to serve until the Fall 2019 Board Meeting. Ms. Noble then installed the new officers.

Next Meeting. The next meeting will be in Rock Hill, SC on October 28, 2018.
