### Creating in the Carolinas

CAR chapters have had fun working on a variety of projects in the past few months. Here are the chapter reports:

### Aiken (Aiken, SC)

The Aiken Stitchin' Belles worked on yarn ort baskets this spring. We experimented with different sizes and styles, including the addition of handles and accessorizing with buttons. For some of us, it was a challenging exercise but we are now pleased with our results.

We are currently preparing for our month-long needlework show at the Aiken County Historical Museum, in

conjunction with the Aiken chapter of the American Needlepoint Guild. New for us this year will be a "Meet the Artists" reception on Sunday afternoon, August 25, from 3 to 5 PM. The show will run from August 20 to September 15 and will feature a variety of techniques. We are looking forward to this chance to share our needlework with the community.





Chicora (Myrtle Beach, SC) At the Chicora Stitchers May and

June meetings, Melanie Scott led the group in stitching Terri Bay's Ukrainian Whitework piece "Winter Lace". It looks beautiful whether worked in white or with a variegated thread.

July's meeting was a chance for everyone to get involved in our service project: pillow cases for Ryan's Case for Smiles. After all the sewing, folding, ironing, pinning, etc., we completed 8 pillow cases (about 1 per member present!) to brighten a child's day.

Lowcountry (Hilton Head, SC) The Lowcountry Chapter EGA has guieted down for the summer as a lot of our members are snow birds. So we had a pot luck lunch in June and now July and August are stitchins to finish up projects.

Public Day in February and at monthly stitch ins for most months. They are coming along well.



Laurel (Hendersonville, NC)
As part of our Outreach Program,
The Laurel Chapter was selected as a
sponsor in the 2019 ArtScape Banner
Project in Hendersonville, North Carolina.

The ArtScape Banner Project began in 2017 to celebrate the arts community and to add color to the historic downtown district. It provides a

showcase for talented artists in Henderson County to display their artwork on a year-round basis. Adult artists were invited to submit their work in this juried event and forty-nine artists were selected encompassing various media. Once the selections were made, 24x40 double sided

vinyl banners were created of each piece of artwork to be displayed in

the downtown district until April 2020.

As a sponsor, The Laurel Chapter's name and two additional lines of information were listed on the banner as well as a listing in the brochure. We also received ArtScape, Facebook and website recognition of our sponsorship. We were pleased to sponsor a Fiber art piece created by Jill

Hsieh.

This sponsorship will enable us to reach thousands of local citizens and tourists who attend the many special events in the downtown area, including the Garden Jubilee, the Apple Festival, the Antique Fair and Art on Main.

Once new artwork is selected in April, our Chapter will receive the

banner for our archives. We also anticipate continuing participation in the ArtScape Banner Project as ongoing outreach.

Serves for a 3-year term. Assists the Region Director and serves in place of the RD in the event that the RD is not available. Coordinates the yearly Spring events: the even-year Seminars and the odd-year Spring Retreats. Serves as a member of the Executive Board which oversees the activities of the Region as a whole. By tradition, automatically becomes the RD at the end of the ARD term.

### Secretary **ELECTED**

Serves for a 3-year term. Prepares handouts and folders for Board of Directors meetings. Takes the official minutes of each meeting of the Executive Board and the Board of Directors, takes attendance at each meeting, and publishes the minutes afterwards. Maintains the official records of the Region. Works closely with chapters and members of Executive Committee to keep member database up-to-date.

### Appointed:

### RegioNews **Editor**

Attends all meetings of the Executive Committee and Board of Directors. Reminds contributors of the deadlines for submitting articles for the RegioNews each quarter and then puts those articles into the final format. Proofreads and adds any other information that may be needed. After sending the draft to the RD for approval, makes any necessary final correctios and distributes the newsletter to all CAR Region members and others (ie: at EGA National) who are on the distribution list. Works with other officers and the chapters to maintain updated membership lists.

### For Spring Seminar 2020 in Clemmons, NC:

### Registrar

Collects registration forms and funds for the Spring 2020 seminar and collates the results. Informs registrants of their status. Keeps track of the numbers to make sure that classes are filled appropriately and reports the data to the RD on a regular basis. Sends the registration funds to the Treasurer on a regular basis for deposit. Tells the RD about the class sizes so that the teachers can be informed. Compiles student folders or assists the Seminar Chair with this task. May also produce the sign-in sheet and name-tags for the event itself.

Schedules volunteers to help during the Seminar and oversees their efforts. Makes sure all positions are filled as required or makes other arrangements as necessary. May contact the volunteers ahead of time to get a head start on setting up the volunteer schedule.

### **Board of Directors Meeting**

Mountain Lodge, Flat Rock, NC Sunday June 2, 2019

**Call to Order.** Region Director Carole Overton called the meeting to order at 10:00 am at the Mountain Lodge, Flat Rock, NC.

**Present.** Region Director Carole Overton, Assistant Region Director Cindi Lemkau, Treasurer Elizabeth Little, and Secretary Cathie Barker.

Also present. Bylaws Chair Becky Buie, EGA President Janet Noble.

**Quorum.** There being delegates from more than one-third (5) chapters present, there was a quorum.

**EGA President's remarks.** Ms Noble explained the national outreach program to benefit our injured service members and displayed the project designs that are available on the EGA website. All the designs for this outreach program will remain on the website during Ms Noble's term of office. Every bit of the money collected will be donated to the Wounded Warriors project.

**Recognitions.** Ms Buie was recognized for continuing past her appointed time to finalize all fifteen chapters' bylaws.

**Minutes.** Without objection, minutes from the Fall Retreat, October 26, 2018 were approved.

### Treasurer's Report. Ms Little reported:

- Spring retreat 2019 will have a small profit.
- The audit for 2018 was completed and approved by the Executive Committee
- Only six program grants for 2019 have been requested as of this time. Each chapter president may request the grant by emailing the Region Director. Ms Overton requested the chapters let her know what the grant is to be used for.

Secretary's Report. No report

**Education Coordinator's Report.** Ms Overton reported for Ms Wiesemann:

- CRESS Scholarship was awarded to Janet Stewart of The Laurel Chapter to attend the International Teachers' Tour class "Screech Owl" by Gary Clarke in November in Hendersonville, NC.
- Ms Wiesemann's term of office will end in October 2019. We're looking for a candidate for the office of Education Coordinator.

ARD Report. Cindi Lemkau – No report.

**Outreach Report.** Ms Strobel requests that all chapters send her their reports of outreach activities.

#### Old Business. Ms Overton reported:

- Spring Retreat 2019 the retreat was formatted using the survey results from last fall. There are 59 attendees.
- Chapters' Bylaws review all but one chapter have completed bylaws review. The final chapter is in the stage of getting all signatures necessary to finalize.
- Job openings there are several Region jobs that will be open in October at our fall meeting. Ms Overton stressed that newly elected officers and appointed committee chairs will have the benefit of working with the outgoing officers to make a smooth transition.
- QuickBooks National Headquarters has mandated that Regions buy QuickBooks. CAR will comply with this request.
- Region website The Executive Committee will be working on redoing the content of CAR's website.




### Lecture:

### **Embroidery and the Arts and Crafts Movement**

By Kim Sanders

Friday Night, October 4, 2019: 7:00 PM - 8:30 PM



Kim will trace the history of the Arts and Crafts style of embroidery, supplementing her discussion with items from her collection of late 1800 and early 1900 embroidery magazines, books, embroidery threads and linens printed for embroidery.

How did needlework change over the years to the point where we now can stitch whatever we like, find patterns for almost anything, and have a wide range of threads and fibers at our disposal? Hear about the development of stitching patterns and the related production of threads. Thread is both the silk that was used for what we now call silk shading and rayon which was marketed as "art silk" until about 1920 when it was renamed rayon.

### Gluminated Kuswife

Imagine an illuminated manuscript with an elegant initial in red surrounded by glittering gems and gold. In the Illuminated Huswife class, we will use this as inspiration to decorate a very practical huswife designed to hold your favorite embroidery tools. Each student may specify the initial of her choice. The initial will be stitched in padded satin stitch. The surround is divided into diamond shapes with surface stitches. Then the diamonds are filled with beaded flowers in the colors of ruby, amethyst, sapphire, citrine and emerald. The huswife is finished with twisted gold cord for a very special sewing accessory. Instructions include clear stitch diagrams on the embroidery stitch and as well as complete finishing information. All materials needed to finish the huswife are included in the kit. Be sure to register early for this class because the class limit is 24 and the spaces will go quickly!

Kim Sanders is a nationally known and respected needlework teacher. She holds a B.S. in Textiles and Clothing from the University of Tennessee. Her connection to EGA is multi-faceted: She is an EGA-certified teacher of Crewel and Surface Embroidery, an EGA Master Craftsman in Smocking and in Surface Embroidery, and Chairman of the EGA Master Craftsman in Smocking, and is a past chairman of the Teacher Certification program. Kim has published many designs and has taught for our Carolinas Region as well as for EGA National Seminars and more.




