

ARDPosition Assistant Region Director: A New Plan!

One of the most important officers in the Carolinas Region is the Assistant Region Director (ARD). This person shadows the Region Director (RD) in order to learn how to take over as RD at the end of the 3-year term and to be able to act in place of the RD should that person be unable to conduct business. As it stands right now, the ARD in the Carolinas Region is also tasked with overseeing the development and

execution of the yearly seminars. With so much being expected, it is not surprising that that position has been empty since our elections in the Fall of 2019. It is critical that we fill this position so that the ARD has time to learn what needs to be done before becoming the RD in the fall of 2022.

After much discussion among the members of the Executive Committee

past.

(EC) and comments from the members of the Region, the EC has decided that it was time to revise the job description in order to attract volunteers to take on the role of ARD.

To that end, the EC will make some recommendations at the upcoming Board of Directors meeting that will need to be voted on at that time. Although these recommendations will be formally presented when the agenda for that meeting is distributed to the members, we would like to summarize the plan here:

ASSISTANT REGION DIRECTOR:

Under this new plan, the ARD will continue to shadow the RD to learn the role. This will include serving on the Executive Committee, learning about the Region, keeping informed about Region and chapter activities, and serving as the assistant to the RD. The ARD will be copied on all communications from the RD so that she/he may be kept informed of all situations. This will allow the ARD to serve in place of the RD should the RD be unable to fulfill the duties on either a short-term or long-term basis so that the Region's work may continue uninterrupted.

SEMINAR DIRECTOR:

One of the most common reasons that people give for belonging to EGA is to meet and to socialize with others who share and understand their passion for needlework. The Carolinas Region has traditionally held a seminar every spring and a retreat every fall to give people from across the Region the chance to get together. Starting in 2019, the Region changed that plan by hosting a retreat in spring 2019 rather than a seminar. The plan was to host retreats in the odd years and seminars in the even years from that time on. (The current pandemic has altered that plan for the coming year. See the message from the RD at top of this newsletter.)

No matter what the schedule ends up being, it is clear that setting up a yearly seminar is a very demanding job. Therefore, the members of the EC propose that we develop a new officer position to focus on just that one aspect: To set up and oversee the presentation of the yearly Spring Seminars and Spring Retreats. There already exists a very detailed In addition, the ARD will be responsible for overseeing some of the occasional events that take place during the year. For example, the ARD would coordinate the effort to nominate members for the Gold Thread Award and would be in charge of attracting and applying for classes through the International Teacher Tour. The ARD would also assist with the planning of and participating in Region events such as hosting a booth at the Sewing & Quilt Expo.

Finally, the ARD will work closely with the RD to plan and oversee the operation of Region affairs, providing critical input to help the Region meet its goals.

The Seminar Director will serve as a member of the Executive Committee, make reports as to the status of the plans during the planning process, and submit a final report at the end of each event.

It is hoped that this division of responsibilities and creation of a new position will be approved by the Board of Directors at our Spring 2020 meeting. Once that has happened, these 2 positions must be filled immediately if our Region is to continue to meet its goals. Please volunteer to serve in one of these capacities. You will find satisfaction in helping the Region and will have the chance to greatly enhance your circle of friends. **We need your help!**

Kristine Cooke was our March volunteer. Attached is a picture of





a squirrel that she designed and stitched in response to many asking her techniques for stitching furry animals. In her own words:

"It is basically a thread-painting technique, using a photograph of the animal as a guide for shading and fur direction. I also showed our members a way of transferring an image onto fabric when one doesn't have a light box, or wishs to stitch on black fabric. It involves cutting out a paper photo of the animal you wish to stitch, and tracing around the cutout. Then, cutting out large body parts (head, hip, tail), and placing those on the fabric on to trace. This results in a transferred pattern to stitch."
