Making the best of the situation

When the CAR Executive Committee met in the middle of July, we discussed the plans for our upcoming Fall Retreat and Board of Directors meeting. We considered the continually rising number of COVID cases in all areas of our Region and tried to anticipate what the situation might be in October.

While debating this issue, we kept

your health and safety at the forefront. We knew the deadline for making a final decision was fast approaching. In the end, although we were all very reluctant to let go of our original plans, we realized that the best decision was to cancel our in-person meeting and move to a virtual retreat and to make this decision in time to publicize it in this newsletter.



However, that does not mean that we are going to give in! We have developed some activities that we think will give you a boost as well as allowing us to conduct necessary business. Keep in mind that we are still refining these plans so there may be a few tweaks along the way, but here is what we are envisioning at the moment.

All activities will take place via ZOOM on Saturday, October 3, 2020. MORNING AFTERNOON

9:30 AM- 10:00 AM: Meet and Greet

Join us for (bring your own) coffee and donuts as we get back together before our Board of Directors meeting. Everyone is welcome to attend.



10:00 AM - 11:30 AM: Board of Directors meeting

All CAR members are welcome to attend. Find out what the Region is working on. If some issues need to be voted on, the eligible voters will move to a ZOOM breakout room to cast their votes should there also be non-voters present. All CAR members will receive the agenda and any related documents by the end of August. All designated voters will receive packets, proxies, and invitations prior to the meeting.



11:30 AM- 12:30 PM: Lunch on your own 12:30 PM - 4:00 PM: Sit and Stitch with Some Twists (you have options)

12:30 - 1:00: Sign in and get settled

1:00 PM – 2:00 PM: Optional Make-it /Take-it class: "Hope," a Ukrainian ornament, with Terri Bay. Pre-registered students will meet with Terri for an overview of the project, a Q&A session, and a chance to schedule any future sessions. Students should not expect to work on the project during this class although they might be able to practice stitches on doodle cloth. When this session is over, students can join in the "Mix and Mingle" sessions (see below).

For Class:

- ~ All students will pay the class fee of \$40.
- ~ A limited number of kits (50) are available for the additional purchase price of \$37 which includes the cost of mailing the kit to the participant's home. These kits will include white material and white threads as well as needles and instructions/chart.
- ~ An unlimited number of participants may take the

class if they want to provide their own materials (a list of supplies is available in the registration brochure). These participants will pay the \$40 class fee and \$18 for the instructions/chart only. The chart will be sent to the student's home before this meeting.

~ **NOTE:** Registration and fees for this class must be received by September 5 in order to ensure timely mailing of the kits and charts. Late registrations for this class will not be accepted. We apologize for the small registration window but hope you will understand.

1:00 - 4:00: "Mix and Mingle" sessions

To give you a chance to feed your need to socialize, we are setting up a series of ½-hour "mix and mingle" sessions. We will split the participants into breakout rooms based on a variety of categories so you can chat

with smaller groups of people, as you would have done by moving from table to table if we had been able to meet in person. At the end of each half hour, you will be assigned to a new room based on another category, giving you a chance to visit with a different group of people.

If you prefer, you can stay in the "big room" (actually, just the regular ZOOM session) and calmly stitch on whatever you want to. Just be aware that it may be more difficult to talk to others in this format.

While we anticipate ending the retreat at 4:00, we will keep the "sit-and-stitch room" open a while longer if anyone wants to stay.

Registration for the retreat itself is free for members of Carolinas Region chapters and \$10 for non-members. There is no fee for attending the BoD meeting that morning. (The only fees are for the optional make-it/take-it class.) However, since we need to know who will be attending in order to send out the invitations and links to the sessions, you will have to submit a registration form by the deadline if you plan to attend even if you do not have to pay anything.



While registration and payment for the <u>class</u> must be received by <u>September 5</u>, registration forms and, if needed, payments for the <u>retreat only</u> are due by <u>September 27</u>. Again, we apologize for the rather short interval given for registration.

The World's Longest Band Sampler

Do you want to stitch something but are tired of looking through your stash? Here is a great opportunity: The San Francisco School of Needlework and Design (SNAD) is looking for embroidery pieces to incorporate into what it is calling "The World's Longest Band Sampler Project."

SNAD has given EGA permission to share a video which describes this effort: https://drive.google.com/file/

d/1J5dmGDdn4eWgtsRmrKqa B16 8ZLmb1lg/view

Because all of the submitted pieces will be sewn together to make one band sampler, the finished dimensions of your design must be 9" wide and between 3" – 5" high. You must include a 1" seam allowance on all 4 sides. There should be no embroidery in the seam allowance areas as they will be used to sew the bands together.

If you submit a band, you should include the following information pinned to your completed piece:

- ♦ Your name
- Your address
- ♦ Your email address
- ♦ Your EGA chapter
- The date or year of creation
- Your Artist Statement (information about your piece, such as what it represents)

You should stitch your band using any embroidery technique you would like on any fabric you like, as long as it can easily be stitched to another band.

We would be interested to see what you submit, so if you decide to enter a band, please send Carole Overton a photo along with your name, chapter, and artist statement so we can share it in the *RegioNews*.

Hearts for Hospice



You may have seen the "Hearts for Hospice" entries on the EGA National website (the July Stitch-along Project). In short, the stitched 5-inch hearts are finished as ornaments for a hospice center. From the EGA website, "When a resident passes away, a heart is placed on the door to remind passersby to be respectful of those mourning. The beautiful needlepoint heart is then given to a family member and becomes a cherished remembrance."

This project was started by the Greater KC Needlepoint Guild (https://www.greaterkcneedlepointguild.com/hearts-for-hospice)

If your chapter would like to participate in this effort, the above website provides two free patterns. GKCNG will finish the hearts, but if you want to finish your own, we have a wonderful set of directions we can share. Just email Carole Overton for a copy.

AlphabetSoup: RD, ARD, SD, and EdC

At our Board of Directors meeting in June 2020, the voters approved the revision of the job description of the Assistant Region Director (ARD) and created a new position called Seminar Director (SD). Along with the Secretary, Treasurer, and Education Coordinator (EdC), those two positions are charged with assisting the Region Director (RD) in carrying out the tasks of the Region.

However, it may look like alphabet soup to many members: RD, ARD, SD, EdC – what does it all mean?

A brief discussion of the role of each of these positions may help. (Since the titles and duties of Secretary and Treasurer seem to be much less confusing, their functions will not be covered in the following discussion. This is in no way meant to detract from the critical importance of those positions.) Please contact Carole Overton if you have questions about those two jobs.

RD

The Region Director (RD) is like the president of a company. Her/His main role is to keep the Region moving ahead, making sure that all needed work is completed in a timely manner, guiding the organization as it grows and as it tries to meet the needs of the members while adhering to the requirements of EGA National. As a member of the National EGA Board of Directors, the RD also has a hand in guiding the direction the national organization takes. The RD is helped in all of these efforts by the other Region officers, the chapter officers, and the members in general.

ARD

The Assistant Region Director (ARD) is like the vice-president of a company. As a member of the Region's Executive Committee, the ARD assists the RD in furthering the Region's mission. The ARD also learns the role of the RD in order to be able to take over when the RD's term is over. As detailed in the newly revised job description, the ARD is asked to supervise and plan some of the Region's activities and serves as a resource for the chapters. The ARD is expected to attend all Region events.

SD

The Seminar Director (SD), a new position for our Region, was created to remove a portion of the workload from what had been the ARD's job description in order to help balance the workloads. Specifically, from now on, the SD will be the coordinator of the spring seminars and spring retreats. This will involve planning the events, supervising all committees, helping to select committee chairs, locating venues, and selecting teachers and classes, with assistance from others as needed or required. The members of the Executive Committee believed that the SD position was needed because people were not willing to volunteer for the position of ARD due to its perceived heavy workload.

EdC

The Education Coordinator (EdC) supervises and coordinates all education and scholarship opportunities in the Region. She/he reviews the education options offered by EGA

National and helps the chapters access these activities as requested. The EdC also plans and coordinates the yearly fall retreats, with help as needed. As a member of the Executive Committee, the EdC also participates in planning and carrying out all Region activities.

PLEASE NOTE:

Although you may look at what we have accomplished this year and feel that your help is not needed, we are definitely in need of your assistance. It is critical that we fill both the ARD and SD positions as soon as possible. Please consider volunteering for the ARD or SD position so that our Region can continue to flourish and to provide the kinds of activities and support that our members want. The job descriptions are attached to this newsletter. If you would like more information, please contact Amanda Pelon (nominating committee) or Carole Overton (RD). You will find their contact information in this newsletter.)

In addition, we need two volunteers to fill open positions on our region's nominating committee. This committee will have to start putting together a slate of candidates to run for office as our current officers' terms will end in the fall of 2022. Although that seems like a long way off, the nominating committee members will need time to get to know the members and to start exploring the suitability of potential candidates.

Carolinas Region (CAR) Assistant Region Director (ARD)

Job Description

- 1. Takes the place of RD in the absence of RD
- a. Stays informed by communicating with the RD regarding Region activities, events, processes, concerns, goals, and programs
 - b. Assists RD in all activities
 - c. Is prepared to take over for RD if RD is unable to continue
- 2. Serves as a member of the CAR Executive Committee (EC) and participates in all CAR EC and Board of Directors meetings
- 3. Develops a good understanding of the Region and its chapters
 - a. Reads and understands the Region's bylaws
 - b. Knows what chapters are in our Region
- c. Contacts each chapter to get the newsletter; reads the newsletter to gain an understanding of what each chapter is doing
- d. Brings to the RD's attention any opinions, concerns, problems, or suggestions from the chapters that need to be addressed
 - e. Serves as a resource for the chapters by answering questions and handling problems
 - f. Submits articles to RegioNews (the CAR's newsletter) about other relevant CAR news or ideas as needed
- 4. Stays current on the policies, procedures, and developments of EGA National
 - a. Reads and understands the National Bylaws, Standing Rules, Policies and Procedures, and National Policies for Regions
 - b. Reads all National board minutes and all Region meeting minutes taken during National board meetings
 - c. Stays updated on EGA activities
- 5. Attends all CAR events and participates in all Region activities
- 6. Maintains a current list of EGA National-approved teachers that the Region can draw upon for seminar and chapter classes
- 7. Prepares reports and articles
- a. Prepares reports for each Region Board of Directors meeting and submits to RD at least 2 weeks before each BoD meeting
 - b. Submits article(s) to RegioNews as needed
- 8. Works with/assists other members of the EC as requested
- 9. Attends National EGA Board Meeting with RD before transitioning to RD position
- 10. Serves as coordinator of Gold Thread nomination process to remind chapters/members to nominate and to answer questions about the process
- 11. Serves as Supervisor of committee that selects and schedules any touring teachers that may be asked to teach at Region or other events (when applicable)
 - a. Supervises the selection process
 - b. Supervises the scheduling process by working with the relevant Region and chapter officers.
 - c. Oversees the evaluation of the touring teachers' classes annually
 - d. Collects and collates names of touring teachers
 - e. Evaluates touring teacher program
- f. Submits a report to the RD about the touring teacher program at the end of that program and, if there have been multiple touring teacher programs during the year, submit a report to the RD
- 12. Takes on other duties as designated by RD and/or as determined by analyzing current and future needs of the Region

Zoom Virtual Meeting Friday June 26, 2020

Call to Order: Region Director Carole Overton called the virtual meeting to order at 2 p.m. using the Zoom app due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Present: Region Director Carole Overton, Treasurer Elizabeth Little, Education Coordinator Janice Wright, and Secretary Laura Smith, Bylaws Chair Becky Buie, Website/Newsletter Chair Cathie Barker, Nominating Committee Chair Sallie Folk, and Invited Guest Seminar Registrar Christine Haimann.

Quorum. There being more than one-third of the delegates present, (23 of 37) a quorum was declared.

Minutes. Minutes from the Fall Retreat, October 6, 2019 were approved as previously emailed.

Treasurer's Report: Elizabeth Little

The Operating Account/Budget for 2020 and Seminar 2020 Account/Budget were provided in previous email. There were no questions. The balance for Seminar 2020 will be carried forward. Ten refunds have been completed and 52 people are registered for Seminar 2021.

- Region Dues have been received from all chapters except Star Stitchers which is in the mail.
- ♦ Seven chapters have requested and received the \$150 Education Grant for 2020. The grant may still be requested until December 1. Please email the request to Carole Overton and provide the name and address of your chapter's treasurer in the email so that the check may be sent.
- The audit for the 2019 region books has not been performed due to COVID pandemic restrictions on meetings.

Education Coordinator's Report: Janice Wright reminded chapters to encourage their members to apply for the CRESS Scholarship and the Roxie Hodgkin grant. There have been no appli-

cations this year. She discussed EGA classes, projects, and opportunities including Group Correspondence Courses, Individual Correspondence Courses, and the EGA Stitch Along on Facebook.

Outreach Coordinator's Report: Carole Overton and Laura Smith reported for Mildred Strobel.

Copies of the report were emailed. Additional items reported were Lowcountry Chapter's Habitat Home plaques and donations for the local food bank and Magnolia Chapter's partnering with Charleston Chapter of the American Needlepoint Guild to do Hearts for Hospice. Old Business: Carole Overton 2019 Fall Retreat Recap

57 people attended. 16 were in Kim Sanders's class, *Illuminated Huswife*. 32 took Betsy Hanson's Make It Take It class, the *Halloween Box*.

The Original Sewing and Quilting Show has been rescheduled to February 18-20, 2021 at the Raleigh Convention Center. A sign up link to volunteer for the show will be in RegioNews. We need projects to display, brochures for each chapter, and volunteers to set up the booth, greet attendees, demonstrate embroidery, and take down the booth.

There was no other old business.

New Business: Carole Overton

Issues: Four motions from the Executive Committee were emailed previously.

Motion 1: We, the members of the Executive Committee, move that the Carolinas Region revise the job description of the Assistant Region Director (ARD) by eliminating the tasks related to seminar development, effective immediately, so that the ARD can focus on assisting the Region Director and preparing to take on the leadership role of Region Director (RD) when needed. **VOTED:** Passed unanimously by those attending plus 8 proxy ballots sent by absent delegates.

Motion 2: We, the members of the Executive Committee,

move that the Carolinas Region create a new appointed position entitled "Seminar Director," effective immediately. This person will (1) supervise the development and execution of the yearly spring seminars and spring retreats, with the assigned duties detailed in the job description and related documents; (2) attend all meetings of the Executive Committee (EC) as a non-voting member; and (3) report on the status of the seminars and retreats to the Region Director, the EC, and the Board of Directors.

VOTED: Passed unanimously by those attending, plus 8 proxy ballots sent by absent delegates.

Motion 3: After discussion, the original motion was amended and the amendment was seconded to read thus:

We, the members of the Executive Committee move that the Carolinas Region increase teacher pay to \$400 per day, effective immediately. **VOTED**: Passed by those attending with one dissenting vote.

Motion 4: After discussion, the original motion was amended and the amendment was seconded to read thus: We, the members of the Executive Committee, move that the Carolinas Region increase teacher per diem to \$60 per day with no receipts needed, effective immediately. **VOTED**: Passed by

those attending with 6 dissenting votes.

Open Positions: Carole Overton stated that we need volunteers for the ARD position, the Seminar Director position, and two Nominating Committee positions. We thank Julia Tison who has completed her term and Sallie Folk who will complete her term in the fall. If you would like to volunteer, please contact Amanda Pelon (laughingfrogsstudio@gmail.com), the remaining committee member, or Carole Overton.

Fall Retreat 2020: Janice Wright, Education Coordinator, reported that the dates will be Oct 2-4, 2020 at the Fairfield Inn in Rock Hill, SC. The room rates have been reduced to \$109 per night. We hope to offer a lecture on Friday night, a make-it/take-it project Saturday morning, a region-wide discussion and demonstration about how to use Zoom to conduct chapter meetings and programs on Saturday afternoon, and lots of time for stitching and show-and-tell. We will hold the Board of Direc-

tors meeting on Sunday morning. Because we face the possibility that we might not be able to meet, we are also exploring alternative scenarios. We will send out registration information as soon as plans are finalized.

Spring Seminar 2021: Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Spring Seminar 2020 was cancelled and rescheduled for May 21 – 23, 2021 at the Village Inn in Clemmons, NC. All teachers were available and will be placed under revised contracts to provide the same classes except for the Rose Sampler class which was cancelled due to low registration. Christine Haimann, Seminar Registrar, reported that the 62 registrants were offered the option of retaining their registrations for the rescheduled seminar. 52 remain registered and 10 cancelled and received refunds. Net income is \$15,118.00 less \$2,415 refunded, leaving \$12,703. Seminar volunteers were thanked: Carole Overton, Seminar Chair; Nancy Gannon, Dean of Faculty; Christine Haimann, Registrar; Elizabeth Little, Seminar Treasurer; Chris Sloane, Volunteer Coordinator; Sue Osterberg, Angel Chair; Julie Anderson, Merchandise Night/Teacher Showcase; Julia Tison, Faculty Amenities; Rosemary Kostansek and Sue Osterberg, Commemorative Committee; and Piedmont Chapter, Luncheon Favors. Looking Ahead

The Executive Committee has been worrying about this upcoming event as we have watched the COVID numbers rise and the state requirements change. We have held some preliminary discussions to see if we can develop an alternate plan, but at the time of this writing we are still planning (and hoping) to hold an in-person event

Board of Directors Meeting, June 2020: Recap

"Mix and Mingle" Sessions: We know that one of the main reasons people attend our seminars and retreats is so they can meet and talk with others. While we have been able to stitch to our heart's content during social distancing and isolation periods, it has not been as easy for us to talk to others. We are therefore offering an afternoon of "Mix and Mingle" sessions for those who yearn for a return to chatting with others. We have developed a series of categories into which we will divide you to participate in ½-hour sessions in "Breakout Rooms" in ZOOM. In these smaller groups, you will be able to get to know others just as you might in person. At the end of the half hour, you will be assigned to a new group based on another category. Think of this as "speed dating" or "musical chairs" or as moving from table to table. We think you will have fun meeting others and our categories will give you something in common to start your conversations. You will have the option of leaving the breakout room before the end of the session if you so desire.

For those of you who find this possibility unnerving (!), you can just remain in the "big room" (actually, just the regular ZOOM session) and calmly stitch on whatever you want to. The only problem is that if there is a large group here you will have more difficulty talking to others.

While we anticipate ending the retreat at 4:00, we will keep the "sit-and-stitch room" open a while longer for those of you who hate to say "good-bye!"

If you register for the Make it/Take it Class, you will be moved into a breakout room with Terri Bay shortly after joining the afternoon session. This session will introduce the project, review special stitches, discuss other resources available, allow time for questions, and look at the schedule for any additional sessions needed. Students should <u>not</u> expect to complete the ornament in this short meeting.



Make-it/Take-it Session: Hope

Designed and taught by Terri Bay

Class Fee \$40 Kit Fee \$ 37

The kit includes 6 X 12 inch piece of 28 count linen, 1 ball pearl cotton size 8, 1 ball pearl cotton size 12, Tapestry 24 needle, Tapestry 26 needle, Chart and Instructions. Only 50 kits are available. Students will pay the class fee of \$40 and the kit fee of \$37.

Option 2: If students want to take the class but not buy the kit, they can pay the class fee of \$40 and the \$18 fee for chart/instructions only. There is no class limit if no kit is requested.

Kits or charts will be mailed directly to each student before the class date.

Hope is a three-dimensional Ukrainian Whitework ornament. This little two-inch-wide beauty is worked with basic Ukrainian Whitework stitches and introduces the student to the spot eyelet which is very common in Ukrainian Whitework but not seen in many other techniques. This is a fun and quick stitch.

Goals: added knowledge of whitework, particularly Ukrainian Whitework, and increased skill with whitework stitches.

Student should be able to answer the question "Why is this Ukrainian Whitework and not Hardanger?"
