

Let's Go CAR Shoppinng!

Looking Back and Looking Ahead

If all goes according to plan, by the time this issue is published the Carolinas Region will have enjoyed its 20^{th} virtual shop tour! Twentieth tour? Wow! I never imagined that we would have so much fun when I first suggested these tours 4 years ago. You might have been on that first visit: to Sandy's X-Stitch on the Go, in Hendersonville, exactly 4 years ago. What a thrill it was to be able to go shopping during Covid!

Since that time, we have travelled virtually around the country, visiting a variety of shops in our region and beyond. We have seen new products, new approaches to stitching, new features and products . . . I don't know about you, but these visits certainly motivated me to stitch, knowing that there were more sources to feed my-insanity... my habit ... my hobby!

Some of you may be wondering why the number of shop tours has slowed in the past year. There are several reasons: Once we returned to "in-person" activities after Covid, shop owners became very busy and, presumably, did not have to rely on virtual tours as much.

In addition, as evidenced by what has happened in our own region, many shops have closed in the past few years. It has also been hard to find shops willing to participate: In my effort to schedule these tours for you, I have contacted 43 shops – including a number suggested by our members. These shops have included cross stitch, needlepoint, knitting yarn, beading, fabric/quilt, brick-and-mortar and online only. Of those 43 contacts, we have managed 20 tours, and that number included a few return visits. [If we have not yet toured a shop that you have suggested, the shop either did not reply or was not interested.]

So what does it take to produce a shop tour? Let's take a look behind the scenes.

When I hear of a shop that might be worth visiting, I spend time looking at its website. Does it offer a variety of products and things that our members might be interested in? How do they do business (in person, by phone, by email)? Are they easy to contact (via the website, phone, email, social media)? Is the website easy to use?

If the shop seems to fit our "criteria," I add it to my list of possibilities, writing down all of the contact information. I try to find the name of the owner so I can communicate directly with her/him.

Then I send the owner an email (followed up by a letter when email does not get a response) explaining who we are and what we would like to have happen, and asking if she/he is interested. This letter also gives a synopsis of what we want to have happen on the tour.

If the owner is interested, I ask to schedule a convenient date/time for the tour and for a short practice session to take place about a week before the tour. Scheduling the tour itself takes some care, as I am always conscious of the fact that our members have chapter meetings and other commitments. I try to vary the date and time of the tours, but I also have to respect the needs of the shop owner. Sometimes it is quite a juggling act!

The practice session gives me a chance to explain my plan for the tour and gives the owner a chance to practice moving the camera around part of the shop so we can work out any bugs in the process. It has been a great way to break the ice with the owner, and it doesn't hurt that I get a quick peek at the shop!

Once the tour has been scheduled, I write up the details and send out the broadcast message to those on the "shop tour" list so they can save the date. Then I schedule the ZOOM session and, a day or two before the tour, send the link out.

I prepare the questions that I want to ask the owner during the tour. These questions are designed to help our members get to know the shop's owner and services. Although I tend to ask the same basic questions to all of the owners, I try to tailor the list to be sure to cover aspects of the shop or the person that I think are special or that our members might be interested to learn about.

On the night of the tour, I open the ZOOM session, admit the members, and host the tour itself, trying to keep up with the questions posted in Chat and looking for raised hands when someone wants to ask a more detailed question.

After the tour, I send a thank you message to the owner. I also download the list of attendees from ZOOM so I can

keep track of the number of people (statistics are always helpful for reports about our region's activities).

I always update my database of shops to keep track of when we toured and how many tours we have offered.

If all of this seems to be a lot of work, it is! I love providing these tours for our members, but am finding it more difficult to keep track of it all. If you would like to help with <u>any</u> aspect of this process, including admitting members to the ZOOM session and/or helping field questions during the tour itself, I would love to talk to you!

I can't promise any future tours, but I am always interested to hear about shops you think might be worth pursuing. Who knows where the next shop tour could take us?

For this retreat, 51 members were registered with 49 in attendance. There were 7 first timers; she encouraged input for future Retreats and Seminars.

Carole Overton (Website) Reported that the website has been updated. She will assist Chapters in establishing and maintaining their individual chapter websites. These websites should be checked for accuracy quarterly. Each chapter should start brainstorming what they want to include on their website. At the CAR's Fall Retreat, the chapters will start to explore the process of building their websites in a working session.

The zoom stitch-ins will continue. These sessions are fun. A lot of information is shared at them.

Millie Stroble (Outreach) Provided a handout on changes to Outreach. Outreach has changed to show that actual contact with the public is needed in order to be considered Outreach. Stitch in Public, Fairs, Craft shows would all be good examples of Outreach.

Gail Smith (RD) Reported that a nominating committee is needed ASAP as we rotate off October 2025. Three people are needed, and recommendations will be accepted. Recommendations should be e-mailed to Gail (regiondirector@egacarolinas.org). There are possible candidates for the positions of Bylaws and for Treasurer.

Next was a discussion of future retreats and seminars. She suggested she check into Lake Junaluska for next Spring's meeting. It was agreed.

There has been some turmoil in the Region. Gail encouraged stitchers to remember the rule "Praise in Public-Correct in Private".

The Tryon Chapter was having issues with the changes in dues. They have lost a couple of stitchers, who are just going to get together and stitch. Those members saw no gain in benefits with the increase in dues. The Chapter is staying in touch with those members.

With all the changes from National concerning dues, the job description for the Treasurer position needs to be amended and the By-Laws changed. This also needs to be done for Membership positions. We don't need to wait for the By-Laws update in 2028. New plural members who are outside the region may have two dues dates. The one for their main chapter and then one for the region. They will need to pay full region dues. Please help them remember these two dates.

Gail announced the winner for the slogan contest for the ad for the Atlanta National Seminar. The winner was the Charlotte Chapter. For the next National Seminar, this item will be included in the budget. The next National Seminar for 2025 will be in Dallas, Texas. The theme will be "Needlework Faire"
