

# Fall is Scholarship Time

Fall is considered a time of change, & it certainly is that! Have you looked at the trees around you & seen the different colors? Have you noticed that the sun is coming up past 7am or setting before 7pm? Have you realized that the morning is just a bit cooler or that the humidity level has dropped a smidge?

Did you ever consider that Fall is the time to begin reviewing the different scholarships that are offered in the CAR or those offered by National? Have you ever thought that you just might be awarded one of these, IF you apply?

So, lets dig in & get the timelines for applying in order. National Scholarships are:

- Legacy Scholarship is due by January 15<sup>th</sup>;
- Mary-Dick Diggges is due by March 1<sup>st</sup>:
- Marjorie Jones is due BY April 1<sup>st</sup>;
- Penny Evans Memorial is due by May 1<sup>st</sup>;
- Genny Morrow Memorial is awarded at National Seminar each year.

Then there are the National Awards, which are *not* scholarships:

- Bobbie Pilling Memorial is due by May 1<sup>st</sup>;
- Gold Thread is due by May 1<sup>st</sup>;
- Golden Needle usually due 2 months before the National Seminar, so you will have to keep any eye out for when it is due.

Now that you have the names and dates, just what makes them different? What is a scholarship? What is an award?

According to my 1988 College Dictionary, the definition of a <u>scholarship</u> is:

\* 2. a *gift* made to a scholar to enable or assist one to pursue one's studies.

Then the definition of gift is:
Something given voluntarily without charge; a present

So, a scholarship is something given voluntarily without charge to a scholar to enable or assist one to pursue one's studies. It is something to help you go down that rabbit hole about a technique you love OR would love to learn more about! Each scholarship has a 'focus', a defined technique of needlework to explore.

The definition of <u>award</u> is: 1. to give a due or merited;

assign or bestow. 2. to bestow or assign by *judicial* decree, 3. something awarded as a prize.

Did you find this one to be very selfexplanatory? I did. A scholarship is to help one learn more about something, and an award is given as a due or merit.

Now the question is, which one will you apply for? Before that, what is holding you back from applying for a scholarship? Do your research and

find the one that fits your stitching technique passion and apply. You could win! Just ask Connie Miller, winner of the Genny Morrow Memorial scholarship!

If it's an award, the Golden Needle award is open to ANY-ONE who submits something that reflects the theme of the National Seminar. The next seminar will be in Dallas, Texas in 2025, and the theme is *Needlework Faire*. What will you stitch up?

These are the scholarships and awards that are from National. You can find out more at egausa.org. Once you have logged in, type 'scholarships' in the search field, then click on 'scholarships and awards'.

For the Carolinas Region, we offer the Carolinas Region Embroidery Study Scholarship (CRESS) and the Roxie Hodgkin scholarship as well as the Gold Thread award. Links and information for these opportunities is on the CAR website, under CAR Scholarships and Awards.

The CRESS is a \$300 scholarship for the study of embroidery, awarded to a Region member. It may be used for almost any embroidery class, including EGA Extended Study Program or an Individual Correspondence course. Applications are due to the Director of Education by May

1st and the class has to be held during the year the award was made. Please note - it may <u>not</u> be used for a Carolinas Region Seminar class.

So, there you have it – the information about scholarships and awards available from National and from the Region. This information should be used by the Chapter President and the Chapter Education/Programs person. Add the dates to your chapter calendars, and make sure that it is put in your chapter newsletters/emails to assist your members in expanding their knowledge and/or improving their skills in needlework.

# National Gold Thread Recipient

The next time you see Janet Noble, congratulate her! Not only was she the 2024 Gold Thread Winner for the Carolinas Region; she was also selected to be

the **2024 National Gold Thread Winner!!!** This makes the 3rd time in the past 4 years that the Carolinas Region's Gold Thread winner was named as the National Winner:

- 2021 Laura Smith (Golden Needles Chapter)
- 2022 –Kim Sanders (The Laurel Chapter)
- 2024 Janet Noble (Millwood Chapter)

If you are new to EGA, you might not know what all of this fuss is about: The Gold Thread Award is EGA's highest award. It is given yearly based on nominations submitted from the members. A national committee makes the selections and aims to have a winner from each region. The award is given "to recognize outstanding individuals who have given freely of their time and talents, and best exemplify EGA's purpose. A total of 13 individuals may be acknowledged - one of each region, with a national recipient selected from among the region recipients and announced at our National Seminar" [from the EGA website].

I always knew that the CAR is filled with members who care about and who support EGA at all levels. Now ALL of EGA knows!!

As excited as I was to see Janet's success, I was saddened to see that 4 regions did not have Gold Thread winners this year. I can't imagine that no one was worthy of nomination, so I have to assume that no nominations were submitted from those regions.

# America's Tapestry

On 26 October 2024, Mr. Stefan Romero presented his project, America's Tapestry, to the Carolinas Region. We had heard about it in bits and pieces all year long, but still had questions.

History is written by the conquerors, and that leaves out a lot of history from other events that helped our fight for independence. Each state has a unique perspective that is to be stitched onto Belgian linen, on a panel that is 35" x 45". How each state manages the stitching can vary from having the panel travel to different areas to having the stitchers travel to the panel. Each state should have a State Director who will work with any state agency that is involved or a historical site that might house the panel where the stitching takes place and help stitchers leave their mark in history.

For North Carolina, the focus is on "The Ladies". What!?, you are thinking? What did The Ladies do and just who were these Ladies? Please include me in that puzzling part, especially me as I am very new to North Carolina. As it turned out, in my local paper, the Friday edition (25 Oct 2024) was an article about The Ladies. The writer, John Hood, had titled his article When Carolina ladies made history. Stop here and check to see if your local paper might have carried his article. I will wait. . . . .

It was Oct. 25, 1774, and Penelope Barker called together about 50 other female residents of the colony's former

capital, Edenton, on the Albemarle Sound. The Ladies were discussing the use of economic pressure to have the British Parliament stop the tax on tea. Mr. Hood writes that the soon-to-be Americans were not opposed to taxation but to the idea that the power of taxation lay with the Colonist legislatures, not with Parliament.

The Ladies of Edenton pledged to not purchase tea or other goods from Britian until a change was made. Was this going to be a hardship? Stop and reflect about shopping back then – almost everything was purchased from the home country! Then there was the fact that England most certainly did *not* like this reduction in income and would retaliate on any Colonial Representative that would be in country, filling the roles of public/business affairs for both sides of the ocean.

Lives were disrupted for many, many months yet the belief that these women were "determined to give memorable proof of their patriotism", is something to be celebrated. This is what the North Carolina panel will be depicting, showing that woman were involved in their world; ready to make sacrifices for self-determination.

Raise a cup of something, other than tea, or come stitch on the America's Tapestry as a way to honor The Ladies and their actions of selflessness for the greater good.

Calling the role, a quorum was established.

Minutes of the last Board Meeting were sent to all delegates via email. The minutes were amended to show that only voting delegates can vote. With that change, the minutes were approved.

Julie Anderson (ARD) gave the results of the survey sent to members. There were 48 responses from members who did not register for the retreat and 24 responses from members who registered for the retreat. The two issues that were noted were:

- Timing. There was not enough time for planning to attend.
- There was not a class being offered.

It was also noted that most of the responders favored the Rock Hill area. Initial results showed that committees need to plan better and include classes. The Carolinas Region is actively recruiting teachers for future retreats.

Carole is scheduled to rotate off next year and is seeking a replacement.

**Cathie Barker (Region News)** reported the Newsletter is due to come out in November. All chapters are encouraged to submit their news as soon as possible. Cathie is also due to rotate off the board and is seeking a replacement.

**Millie Stroble (Outreach)** Report is due to National by the end of December. She will send out a report for information from Chapters.

Gail Smith (RD) Reported on new business
The Nominating committee needs two more people.
Many Board members are rotating off and if replacements are not secured, the Region is in danger of being dissolved.

As of 2025, no paper reports will be accepted at the Region or National level. All reports must be submitted electronically.

Gail also recognized Janet Noble as the National Gold Thread recipient for the Atlanta Seminar.

A few issues that need to be addressed at National will center around plural members. This will be addressed at a later date, but chapters are reminded to make sure any plural member is in good standing with their primary chapter. No member-at-large can also be a plural member at the same time.

The "Grow Your Chapter" monthly zoom sessions are to encourage each chapter to grow. These are also available on the National website.

Stephan with the America's Tapestry project will be presenting a power point this afternoon. The participation for the project will be on a chapter-by-chapter basis.


